### INFORMED: Business Licence Renewal Time

#### Business Finder Application Helps Connect Citizens With Local Business

Business licence renewals have been sent out to all businesses in Maple Ridge. There are a number of benefits to having a business licence. It allows the City to regulate the locations and types of businesses operating in the community and assists in the development of demographic and statistical information on the local business climate.



In 2017, the launch of the City's new Open Government Portal featured a business finder component to the 'What's Happening Around Me' (WHAM) application that links to the bigger 'Business Finder Application' located at [gis.mapleridge.ca/businessfinder/businessfinder.html](http://gis.mapleridge.ca/businessfinder/businessfinder.html).

You may be eligible for the 'Inter-Municipal' Business Licence program that allows you to operate in any of the 11 communities

Business licensing also supports parking enforcement, community policing and the Adopt-A-Block program. The data gathered as part of annual business licensing is also used by Economic Development to produce promotional materials aimed at attracting business investment and job creation in the community.

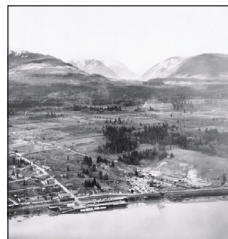
#### Celebrate Heritage Week February 18 to 24

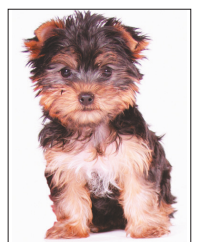
##### Council Meeting Videos

If you are unable to attend a Council Meeting or Public Hearing meeting you can now watch these meetings on your computer 24/7. The entire unedited meetings are posted two to three days after the meeting. The video is indexed to the agenda package so that you can watch them in their entirety or click through by agenda item. ### INFORMED: Dog Licence Renewals

#### Dog Licences Are Due by January 31. Renew Online!

When you receive your dog licence renewal notice in the mail, look for the account number and access code that can be used to renew your dog licence. Go to [mapleridge.ca](http://mapleridge.ca) and select 'Online Services'. Payment can be made by credit card or Interac from most major banks.



Your dog's tag and receipt will be mailed to you. You still have the option of renewing by phone, mail or in person at the Finance counter in the reception area of City Hall. Check out other online services available including the Home Owner Grant application and your tax accounts. It's your 'virtual' City Hall! Remember that there is a substantial discount if you renew by January 31. Up until January 31 the licence fee is \$25 for spayed and neutered dogs and \$52 for unaltered dogs. After January 31, the licence fee is \$41 for spayed and neutered dogs and \$68 for unaltered dogs. This year, seniors (65+) get their dog licence at a 50% discount. Up until January 31 it's \$12.50 for a licence for spayed and neutered dogs and \$26 for unaltered dogs. After January 31, the licence fee is \$20.50 for spayed and neutered dogs and \$34 for unaltered dogs.
