## Mayor Morden Thanks Chamber and DMRBIA for Leadership on Local Economy Restart

Maple Ridge, BC: On Thursday, May 14, the Maple Ridge/Pitt Meadows Chamber of Commerce and the Downtown Maple Ridge Business Improvement Association (DMRBIA) organized and hosted an online forum to discuss the next Phase of the BC Restart Plan. The event was moderated by entrepreneur Taryn Stephenson and panelists included Minister Lisa Beare, MLA Bob D'Eith, Ineke Boekhorst (DMRBIA), Chris Back (WorkSafeBC), Brenna Ayliffe and Sarah O'Connor (both from Fraser Health). Participants from the City of Maple Ridge included Mayor Morden, Wendy Dupley, Director Economic Development, and Chad Cowles, Manager of Community Social Safety.

"I appreciate the organizers putting this session together. Access to multiple levels of government during COVID-19, through events like this, has lead to collaboration, cooperation and effective communication, providing clarity around responsibilities. WorkSafeBC and Fraser Health clearly explained <u>what businesses need to know</u> when they reopen," said Mayor Morden.
