SPOTLIGHT ON: ShakeOut BC October 17, 2013 at 10:17 am

What would you do if there was an Earthquake? Do you have a Plan?

On Thursday, October 17 at 10:17 am District staff will join millions of people around the world as part of an earthquake awareness program called ShakeOut. This is an annual event held the third Thursday of October. It's growing into a worldwide event for countries that are located on active earthquake fault lines.

The District encourages all businesses to participate in this event. It's easy to register on the ShakeOut BC website: www.shakeoutbc.ca. The website is filled with great information and links to help organize your participation at home and in the workplace.

The critical thing to do in an earthquake is to "Drop, Cover, and Hold On." Here's a breakdown of the three steps for the exercise:

1) Drop, Cover, and Hold On: 'Drop' to the ground, take 'Cover' under a table or desk and 'Hold On' to it as if a major earthquake were happening. Remain in this position for at least 60 seconds. Practice now so you will know what to do to protect yourself during an actual earthquake!

2) While still under the table, or wherever you are, look around and imagine what would happen during a major earthquake. What could fall on you or someone else? What could become damaged? What would life be like after?

3) Finally, practice what you will do after the shaking stops. Do you have a communications plan for your family? Do you have a 'Grab and Go' bag at the office and a Survival Kit at home?
