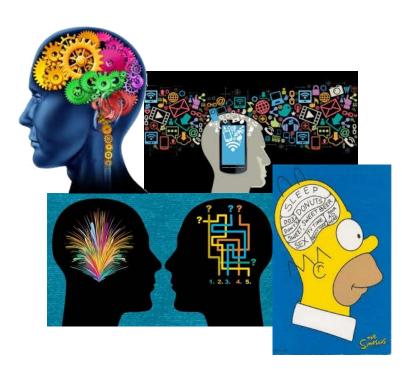

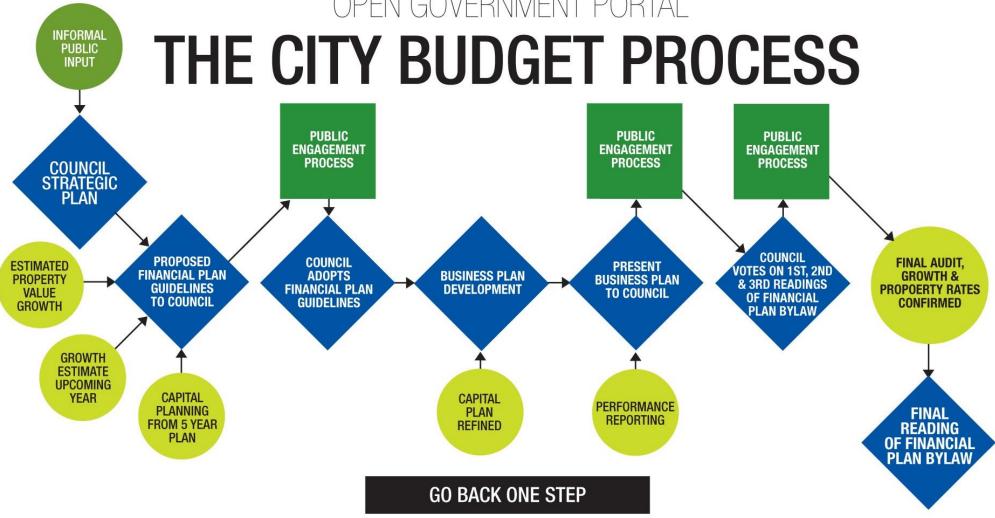

This document is the City of Maple Ridge Corporate Business Plan. It is comprised of Business and Financial Plans for all City departments. The Business Plans follow a consistent structure, and this guide is intended to lay it out for you, to help make your reading experience positive.

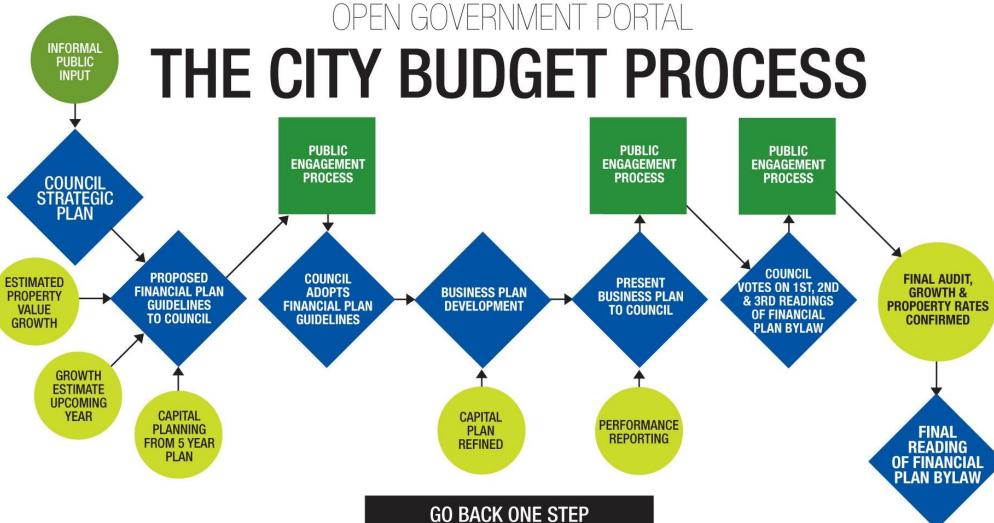
The Business Plans are split into four categories, representing the "Divisions" within the City's organizational structure:

- 1. Administration Office of the Chief Administrative Officer (ADMIN)
- 2. Community Development, Parks & Recreation Services (CDPR)
- 3. Corporate & Financial Services (CFS)
- 4. Public Works & Development Services (PWDS)

Each departmental Business Plan follows this structure:

- 1. Header area defines the Division name and Department name.
- 2. Strategic Alignment
 - This section explains how each department's business plan aligns with higher level guidance, such as Council direction, master plans, policies and Provincial and Federal legislation.
- 3. Business Perspective/Environmental Scan
 - This section highlights a few of the top issues that affect each department today or will
 do so in the next few years. It is not an exhaustive list; limiting it to the top few focuses
 attention on the issues that matter most.
- 4. Efficiency and Effectiveness Highlights
 - This section highlights a few examples where each department has enhanced the value it
 provides to the organization and the community.
- 5. Customer Service Highlights
 - This section highlights areas where each department has embedded a "How Can I Help You?" approach in addressing issues of our internal and external customers, or have implemented new initiatives to enhance customer service.
- 6. Interdependencies
 - This section outlines key areas of dependency on other departments or outside individuals or agencies that are needed in order to be successful in delivering on the Business Plan.
- 7. Departmental Overview
 - In this section, each department summarizes the services they provide and a list of key
 customers; in addition, their organization chart is outlined. For departments who have a
 mission and values for their area, those are also included.

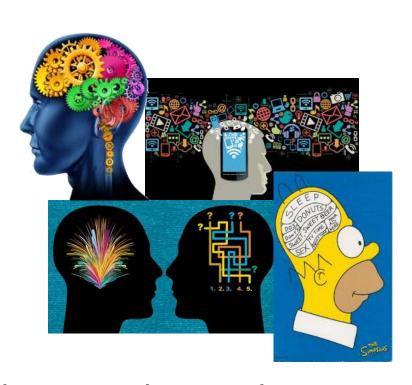
