The goals of the Neighbourhood Small Grants program are to:

- Connect and engage neighbours (e.g. a block party, snow angel party or a social gathering)
- Share residents' skills and knowledge (e.g. yoga instructor teaching a free class)
- Build a sense of ownership and pride in community (e.g. cleaning up an alleyway)
- Respect and celebrate diversity (e.g. multicultural community kitchen)
