Maple Ridge Fire Department Lifts Fire Ban

Maple Ridge, BC: The total ban on outdoor burning within the City of Maple Ridge has been lifted as of noon, September 19, 2017. This follows the BC Wildfire Service's relaxation of campfire restrictions in parts of the Coastal Fire Centre's jurisdiction.

Weather forecasts are calling for cooler temperatures and precipitation. As of noon today, only residents in the "open to burning" area of Maple Ridge will once again be allowed recreational fires as per the Maple Ridge Outdoor Burning Regulation Bylaw No. 4111-1998.

To determine if you live within the "open to burning" area, you can refer to the City's Ridgeview map located at <u>gis.mapleridge.ca/ridgeview</u>.
