Maple Ridge Wildlife and Vector Control Bylaw No 7437-2018 states receptacles are to be placed out no earlier than 5:00 am and are to be removed no later than 7:00 pm on collection day.

This bylaw includes provisions to reduce human/wildlife interactions and ensures the protection of wildlife, public safety and prevents the spread of infectious disease with our City.

Update for park amenities and recreation facilities!

Maple Ridge has reopened select park amenities with new physical distancing rules following the recommendations from the BC Restart Plan. These amenities include Disc Golf, Skate Parks, Running Tracks, Trails, Tennis Courts, Pickleball Courts, Sports Fields, Playgrounds, Bike Skills and Lacrosse Boxes. These park amenities are open for informal/casual use only. Portable washrooms are being reintroduced in these parks and permanent public washroom facilities are reopening with enhanced cleaning protocols.

Basketball Courts, the Hammond Outdoor Pool, Leisure Centre, and Greg Moore Youth Centre will remain closed until further notice to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 transmission.

Our Youth Mentorship Program is back and ready to roll out starting June 1st. PRC Youth staff will be leading youth mentors through training as we adapt our program to include further cleaning and sanitation methods. This will be a twelve week leadership development program designed to prepare youth to become

positive role models in our community. They will build on leadership skills and work with staff to create a positive culture for everyone at the park and provide users with information on the safest way to physical distance while being able to recreate and interact with friends.

New Street Banners Designed by Kwantlen and Katzie Artists Coming Soon



New street banner designs will be installed in the coming weeks across Maple Ridge. The designs are created by artists Phyllis Atkins (ġratiċa), Kwantlen Nation and Trenton Pierre (słóməxr), Katzie Nation.

Atkins images depict salmon, sun and water as part of a new public artwork installed at Telosky Fieldhouse recently called "A Bear's Feast" (**sħanaqs k"a spe?a0**). She explains further, "Indigenous people

depend on our connection to the land and water for gathering and harvesting our traditional foods to sustain our families and community throughout the year. It's also an important cultural practice that we "set the table" and a feast is shared before all ceremonies or important work is undertaken."

Pierre shared a smiling hummingbird over a sunrise that reflects a theme of love and acceptance and being mindful of our environment. The artwork symbolizes a new dawn in an age of creating space for everyone.

Thomas Haney Tennis Courts Restoration



Work has started on renovating the tennis courts at Thomas Haney Secondary School. These courts are the City's main tennis court facility with five regulation tennis courts. This work includes grinding out the existing asphalt, re-paving and painting

on a new playing surface. A geotextile membrane will also be installed to provide longevity for the asphalt surface. This work is anticipated to be completed by the end of June.

Spring Flowering Bulb Displays in Full Bloom

The great weather in May helped maximize the appeal of the spring flowering bulb displays this season. From top to bottom, display pictures include the softer whites and yellows in the City Hall North entry beds; eye popping, traffic stopping mix of vibrant colors at the 224 Street (at Selkirk Ave) median, and a stunning orange in the planters in the Maple Ridge cemetery.



Whonnock Lake Canoe and Kayak Improvements project

The Ridge Canoe & Kayak Club (RCKC) currently shares a facility with the Whonnock Lake Centre & Hall. RCKC is a growing club with a strong school outreach program. Their current facility does not meet the needs of the club, primarily in terms of space required for training, changing, and team gathering. Another challenge is boat storage needs, and the distance to the water from their current storage facility.

This project will involve removal of the existing T-shaped floating pedestrian dock, and the design and construction of new floating pedestrian docks, a floating building platform, and above-platform boathouse. In addition to the dock, the project will include a complete interior renovation of the Ridge Canoe & Kayak Clubhouse.

Maple Ridge Secondary School Update



Work continues on several projects at Maple Ridge Secondary School. The new bleacher building is starting to take shape, formwork is in progress with plans to pour concrete later this week. Underground rough-ins for plumbing are complete, and

storm servicing is in progress. Construction is also well underway for new track lighting, with all underground conduits complete, and plans to install the new lighting poles in early June.
