The Hammond Area Planning Process has launched and there's a new landing page on the Maple Ridge website called #MyHammond. In addition, we've created a special email address *myhammond@mapleridge.ca*, which you can use if you have questions, comments and contributions to make to this exciting work.

The first phase of the project is called the Hammond Community Character Photo Project and seeks to connect citizens with the project and to complete important background work in exploring the history and character of the neighbourhood. To achieve this goal we are asking you to take photos that capture the character of the neighbourhood and then place these pictures on Facebook or Instagram with the hashtag #MyHammond, so that everyone will be able to search for them. In addition to the photos and hashtags, we are asking citizens to provide a brief one or two word description of what the photo symbolizes. Facebook photos are the easiest to search, but if you prefer Instagram, make sure that you follow the Maple Ridge Instagram page 'yourmapleridge' so we can see your masterpieces. You also have the option of emailing your photos and brief descriptions to the special project email.

Maple Ridge will hold an open house in early June, where these images and the descriptions will be displayed so that



all participants can get a sense of how their 'lens' on the community is similar or different than their neighbour's. In addition to displaying the photos, all of the one and two word descriptions will be used to create a 'word diagram' that will graphically reflect the importance of certain key words from the participants.

INFORMED: Construction Season Begins



Maple Ridge recently launched an update to our website and one of the great new tools for citizens is the 'Notify Me' feature. At this time of year the weather starts to improve and our Engineering and Operations crews begin their work on maintenance

and new construction projects on our road, water, sewer and storm water systems.

This means that there are delays and detours on our roads during the construction period. Some projects, like the upcoming installation of streetlights along 122 Avenue will not cause too great a traffic delay. But a project like the installation of the traffic circle at Kanaka Way, which commences in April while the local students are on their break, will have a greater impact.

Click on the 'Notify Me' icon on the home page and provide either your email address or cell phone number and sign up for the Traffic Alerts so that you will know when our crews or our contractors are out there doing work. By planning an alternate route or scheduling your trips around the work schedule you will save time. Take a few moments to explore the Engineering department page and you will find a list of projects that are underway in the 'Neighbourhood Improvements' tab. There's lots of ways to get the information you need to avoid any construction delays in 2014!
