Heritage Achievement Award - Community Initiatives Don Brayford (posthumous)

Installed in 1989, the Beast is unique. On the hour, it rears up, front legs fluttering, and tail beating the air. A labour of love created by Don Brayford, the Beast took several years to build. It was made using local recycled materials, and brought alive by a Commodore computer linked to 54 hydraulic valves, giving it motion. Westminster chimes rang out from a household clock, amplified to two speakers from within the statue. Recently updated by clockmaker Ray Saunders, the Beast is a testament to human ingenuity, and to a community that allows individual spirit to flourish.
