New Cultural Facilities Rental Grant Program – Deadline February 15

The new Cultural Facilities Rental Grant program was launched last fall and offers assistance to non-profit, community-based performing arts organizations for some of the costs (including technical and front of house labour) when using *Maple Ridge civic facilities*. The program is intended to assist with artistic development, increasing the arts profile and expanding audiences for organizations by providing access to a well-equipped, professional ACT Arts Centre venue and other community-based *civic venues*. The program will support Maple Ridge theatre organizations that have a mission to deliver annual public artistic programs at a community and/or professional level. **The next deadlines are February 15 for 2017 facility use requests** (Jan. through Dec) and **October 30 for 2018 requests**. BC Marks Canada 150 with Cultural Legacies Funding Program

The Province of British Columbia is acknowledging this significant milestone by investing in legacy culture and heritage projects in communities throughout the province. This momentous occasion will be recognized through one-time grants of up to \$100,000, for public and not-for-profit museums, art galleries, archives, cultural centres, historic places and heritage sites. The funding will be administered, on behalf of the Province, by the BC Museums Association (BCMA) with support from Heritage BC. Deadline Feb. 10. 



Earth Day Volunteer Opportunity
