

PROPOSED PARK DEVELOPMENT

OPEN HOUSE - November 29th, 2017

Project Description

This proposed neighbourhood park is approximately 1.6 hectares (4.0 acres). The existing site is characterized by deciduous trees, remnants of a commercial greenhouse, and a grassy field sloping towards Rainbow Creek. A new local road (238th St.) has recently been installed along the west edge of the future park.

There are environmentally sensitive areas surrounding Rainbow creek to the east along with an existing trail network.

The Fire Department is proposing to develop the south portion of the site into the future Albion Firehall #4 and training grounds.

The City proposes to develop the north portion of the site into a neighbourhood park with input from the community on desired amenities and features.
