

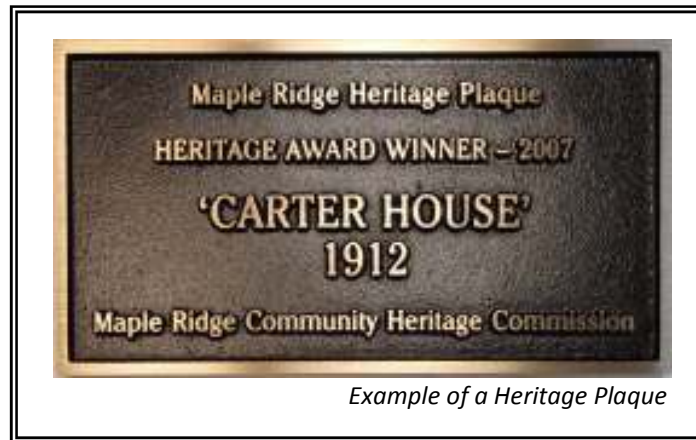

Dear Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in taking part in the District of Maple Ridge Community Heritage Plaque Program. This is an excellent opportunity to increase our sense of community and identity the rich heritage built by those who founded and developed Maple Ridge.

Each plaque will state the date (or approximate date) of construction, the original owner or builder, or notable owner and the owner's primary occupation.

All buildings constructed before 1950 are eligible and will be considered.

We encourage you to research the history of your property and to help you we have included the package "Ideas for Researching Your House or Building".

To request a Heritage Plaque, please complete the application form attached and include;

- Current photograph of the building
- Historic Photograph, if available
- History of house
- Who built the house?
- Any history on the house, example: family records, newspaper articles

Submit your completed application and verify the submitted research as best you can. It is often helpful to talk with friends and neighbours who have been long time Maple Ridge residents. It is important that the information you submit accurately describes the history of your building. A member of the Maple Ridge Community Heritage Commission will contact you once the application is processed and will advise you of the expected date of delivery of your plaque from the Heritage Plaque Program.

All information will be kept in the District of Maple Ridge Archives. If you have a friend, neighbour or family member in the community who may be interested in this program, please pass along this information. Please note that no cost is required from the owner of the property for the Heritage Plaque.
