The Statutory meeting opened at 10:00 a.m., January 3rd and the Reeve and full Council present.

Magistrate Hope took the declarations of the following: Councillors Johnson and Dunlop; Park Commissioners Jackson and Nightingale; School Trustees Mrs. Blackstock and Dr. Huculak. Following this invocation prayers were entered by the Rev. A.L. Davis. The Reeve then asked for one minute silence in respect to the passing of the late Clerk, Mr. H.M. Davenport.

After the Council took their seats, the Reeve reminded them that their duty was to legislate for Maple Ridge as a whole and that this year this would be none too easy. He pointed out that the disturbance caused by the Assessment Equalization Act was as upsetting as providing the necessary funds to replace the large bridge at Websters Corners. The Reeve asked for the Council's support, co-operation and good attendance at all meetings.

He now appointed the following committees, the first named acting as chairman:

The Reeve and full Council

The Reeve felt that it was now necessary to appoint a new committee which he named as Traffic and Parking. He recommended that outside representation should sit on this board such as a member of the School Board and Board of Trade. With the Council's approval he recommended that Corporal Clavert act as chairman. Councillors Johnson and Wood representing the Council Councillors Johnson and Wood representing the Council.

Minutes of January 7th, 1955.

Regular monthly meeting took place on January 7th, full Council present.

Moved by Coun. Johnson and Dunlop: That the minutes of December 3rd, 15th, and 30th as circularized be adopted:

Mr. Malmin addressed the Council asking relief from the flooding of his property caused by the road ditch on 32nd Ave. The foreman together with representation from the Council would personally investigate the situation and Mr. Malmin would be either notified personally or by letter of the results.

Mr. A. Nelson again presented his subdivision plan to the Council. Quite a long discussion followed which resulted in the motion as follows:

CARRIED

Mr. Pat Carr asked for permission to commercialize the NE corner lots of his subdivision at the Lougheed Highway and Carr Avenue. As this location was within the residential area, the matter would be first referred to the Town Planning Commission. The Clerk to so advise.

Mr. Rubens, representing Recreation Committee Programmes Branch, approached the Council recommending that they set up a committee or appoint a member of the Council to investigate the advantages offered by the Committee Programmes Branch of the Department of Education. He presented considerable literature on the matter and Councillor Johnson volunteered to analyze same and report to Council later.

Foreman, O. W. Lilley, now presented to the Council the necessity of purchasing a new truck. Clerk was ordered to call for tenders after contacting the Machinery Committee for a three ton truck, less hoist and box.

A problem of the foremans was also the over-flowing of the 7th Ave. main sewer line. He felt that this was caused by excessive rains plus drainage from down pipes, etc. into the sewer line.

He felt that also there may be a conjestion caused by the departure of the main line from 7th Ave. and back again. As the Council were already conversant with this major problem, the matter was left over for still further investigation as to a remedy.

The Clerk was ordered to contact Fraser Valley Pile Driving Co. to investigate the sewer outlet into the Fraser River as recommended last year.

Foreman also brought up the matter of the Madson's fill on 15th Road and 22nd Road with a view to installing culverts. Permission was granted. He also reported on the inability of the small type drainage lines on MacKenzies and McIntosh Streets which were installed by the owners years ago. He felt that it would now be a major expense on the Municipality to replace same with larger tile. Foreman also reported that he had investigated the flooding of the Haney Garage Furnace Room but at the moment had not yet discovered the reason for this, and he was very doubtful whether it was a liability against the Corporation. He would report later.

Mr. Belsey, corner of 5th and Lougheed Highway requested the Council to do something to eliminate the pool of water that was always present at that corner. This matter would also be left to the foreman.

Councillor Dunlop reported that the stop signs at Dartford & Lorne Road needed replacement, and would the foreman attend to this.

Letter from the Whonock Ratepayers Community Association listing items of necessary work to be accomplished was referred to the foreman.

Foreman reported necessity of providing a new garbage dump within two months.

A letter from Mrs. Davenport to the Clerk requesting him to convey to the Reeve and Council her sincere thanks for their help and kindness during the illness of her late husband and Municipal Clerk was read. The Council felt that their sympathy was very necessary at this time.

The Reeve reported the meeting of the Councillors with Mrs. Webster at the Thornhill subdivision and that a satisfactory conclusion to the matter had been arrived at.

The Reeve appointed Councillor Simmonds as the 1955 Council representative to the Lower Mainland Regional Planning Board, and also Councillor Dunlop as representative to the North Shore Highway Association.

Councillor Simmonds gave a short report on his attendance at the annual meeting of the Lower Mainland Regional Planning Board which dealt mostly with helicopter landing ports.

Special meeting opened on January 26th, at 7:30 p.m. Present were the Reeve, Councillors Simmonds, Bailey, Johnson and Dunlop.

Mr. A. Neilson was present to support the approval of his subdivision plan, which was approved by motion as follows:

Moved by Coun. Bailey and Dunlop: That proposed subdivision of Lots 2,3,4,5,6,7, and 8 (P.13666) of Pt. of Lot A of Lot 7 & Ptn. of Lot A of Lot 7 (P.7250) of Ptn. of the SW of Sec. 23, Tp.12, NWD be tentatively approved. Subject to provisions of Road Subdivision Bylaw requirements & Foreman's acceptance of road.

CARRIED

Mr. George Livesey representing the Civic Centre requested the Council to grant either a donation towards the Gentre or as an alternative would the Council provide the fuel oil for heating purposes. It was mutually agreed that for the next three months the Council would supply the necessary fuel oil and the matter would then be reconsidered.

Mrs. Ansell was present and asked for permission to be granted the usual six months licence for operating a Beauty Salen on Selkirk Street. As this was in the residential section fringing on the commercial area, the following motion was approved pending the Town Planning Committee's recommendation:

The matter was discussed and apparently there was no violation of any bylaw that the Municipality had on file, therefore, the Council could not help them in the matter. The delegation left with the promise that the matter would be referred to the Health Officer:

Correspondence dealt with a letter of thanks and appreciation from Mrs. P. Hill for the attendance of the Reeve and Council at the funeral of her late husband, Reeve Hill of Mission.

Request was read from District Engineer, M.S. Imgram, that it was necessary to have the secondary highway estimates forwarded to his office by February 15th.

Another letter from Public Works Department was read and noted. This dealt with the Websters Corners Bridge. His letter recommended that for the time being the bridge could be repaired and certain portions replaced. The Provincial bridge inspector would again visit the present early part of February and tonfirm the recommendations.

Mr. G. S. McNutt asked for a lease on the water front of particular lot described as "U" of D.L. 202-203, Sk.3633. Council were not prepared to grant any lease for more than one year, the renewal of which would be considered annually. The following motion was passed:

was the date of their annual meeting which would be held in the Health Centre at 8 p.m. The date and time was noted by Reeve and Councillors.

Request in writing from Joe St. Jean that he wished to purchase the W Ptn. of the Nth ½ of the NE¼, Section 3, Tp.12. Clerk was to notify Mr. St. Jean that this was not for sale.

Mr. S. E. Millar notified the Council to place a sign on 6th Road West of 21st Avenue approaching the gravel pit as this was a danger to drivers. The foreman and Council felt that this would serve no purpose but the matter would be investigated.

E. & L. Skippen requested by letter that the promise of the Council to complete the gravelling at the east end of 15th Road made some time ago be fullfilled. The foreman was to be instructed to carry this work out.

A letter from the Canadian Pacific Railway with reference to the Lorne Road crossing in answer to the Council's recommendation that they participate in the cost of providing the fill to the approach was not acceptable to the Railway Co.

Letter from the Haney-Hammond Motor Freight relative to the bad condition of the Road on Selkirk Street West of 8th Ave. and also on the Dewdney Trunk Road on $8\frac{1}{2}$ Ave. was to be referred to the foreman for attention.

The Federal Department of Public Works notified the Council that the complete replacement of the Haney Wharf was being considered by them, and expressed their wish to meet representatives of the Council and the public that uses the wharf at a suitable date. It was left to the Clerk to arrange a meeting with the Reeve and Mr. Edwards of Maple Ridge Mill.

A petition was received and read from property owners in the vicinity of $9\frac{1}{2}$ Ave. who requested considerable public services in the matter of improvement of roads and cleaning ditches, also the installation of a light. Clerk was to turn the matter over to the road foreman, and notify the petitioners provision of lights would be under local improvement:

The result of the matter was still in abeyance and no decision was arrived at other than that he would take up the matter with a view to a claim with the insurance agents which would be dealt with when presented.

Tenders for the purchase of a new truck were now considered. Bids were on hand from Haney Garage, Park View Motors, Martin Motors, and West Coast Motors, and the following motion was finally approved:

Minutes of February 4, 1955.

The regular monthly meeting convened at 9:30 a.m., Friday, February 4th. Present were the Reeve and Councillors Wood, Simmonds, Bailey and Dunlop.

Moved by Coun. Simmonds and Wood: That the minutes of January 3rd, 7th, and 26th as circularized be adopted.

CARRIED

A representative of the Salvation Army was present and reminded the Council to consider a grant for the current year to their institution. The Reeve and Council promised him their full support as in other years, and that it would be taken care of when the budget was brought down.

Mr. Gadsby presented a small petition requesting the Council to consider the naming of their road as Garden Drive. He was informed that the whole situation with regard to naming roads was under consideration and a modern numbering system is to be instituted very shortly. The Clerk was to take note of their request.

Mrs. C. Elberg of Selkirk Street asked for reimbursement of a ditch fill that she had made in front of her property. She was guite willing to bear the expense of the tile if the Council would pay for labour and gravel which amounted to \$16.00. The foreman was to investigate the matter and report whether the job was satisfactory.

Messrs. Hilland, Cordoni, et al, presented a petition addressed to the Reeve and Council which asked for their support in endeavoring to bring about pressure on all contractors, etc. that will be carrying work projects in Maple Ridge to hire local labour wherever possible. Council were unanimous with this thought. The Clerk was to notify the Minister of Labour, Attorney General and Public Works Minister, Gaglardi, that it should be specified if possible when contracts were let relative to the new Provincial institution which will be built shortly that local labour be employed whenever possible.

Mr. Zirk of North Street who anticipated building two or three houses in that vicinity asked that the end of North Street be opened. As this was a very major project which had been considered many times by the Council and rejected, they felt they could give him no assurance that this would be done.

Chairman, A. Chatwin, of the Parks Board asked that his Board be granted an initial appropriation pending the bringing down of the budget. This was granted to a maximum of \$1000.

Moved by Coun. Bailey and Dunlop: That the sum of \$1000.00 be advanced to the Parks Board, pending of the Budget for 1955.

CARRIED

Moved by Coun. Bailey and Dunlop: That the unexpended balance of the 1954 Parks Board be carried over on the understanding that the \$1550.00 in question be set aside for the specific purpose of Aggie Hall capital construction.

CARRIED

Mr. Shirk of the Maple Ridge Auto Court felt that he had been paying too much for his Trade Licence and that a refund sould be in order for the last year. Collector, Mr. Young, was asked to explain the situation and after doing so, he would visit the property and make a check of the babins in use and restitution would be made if Mr. Shirk had over paid.

Road foreman, Lilley, now reported problems that he faced and recommended that the Selkirk Street regarding drainage could only be permanently rectified by installation of concrete gutters; and the $8\frac{1}{2}$ problem and $10\frac{1}{2}$ Ave. also was a matter of replacing the improvised crossing provided or made by the owners. These were not adequate and should all be replaced.

Minutes of February 4th, 1955, continued

The Clerk was to notify the petitioners that if they provide the 12" concrete pipe at approximately \$1.25 per running foot, the Corporation would ditch and install them.

Councillor Dunlop reported to the foreman the problem that exists on the corner of Maple Crescent and Datford St. with reference to the sidewalk. It was felt by all that the foreman should recap same.

Moved by Coun. Dunlop and Bailey: That the sidewalk from 2nd Avenue along Maple Crescent be recapped to approximately Cutlers old butcher shop.

CARRIED

A request was heard from Mr. Bond, Civil Defence Co-ordinator, that a telephone be installed in the basement of the hall for the Co-ordinator's use. This was granted.

Two letters from the Town Planning Commission relative to zoning were read and tabled for longer discussion at next meeting.

Roll 1801 Maple Ridge Lumber Co. represented List No. 83 by Mr. D. Edwards protested the machinery value of \$859 50.00 as being too high. He admitted that the figure declared by him was prepared by the Universal Appraisal Co. and the application of the Assessment Dept. multiplier and depreciation allowance appeared to be correctly applied and the residual figure was still in excess of their purchase price. The local assessors had been and still were of the opinion that due to the age of the machinery-and the fact that most of it was now obsolete the depreciation factor shown be revised. Both Financial statements and Fire Insurance appraisals were produced and reduction was allowed from \$85950.00 to \$59930 machinery value only. The reduced figure was still in excess of Fire Insurance value and also that recorded in the Company's Financial statement. However, Mr. Edwards on behalf of his Company would accept the reduced figure for 1955 without protest. He felt that the machinery had been overvalued by his appraisal Co.

and did not blame the local Assessors.

Roll 1961/2 Port Haney Brick Co. represented by Mr. J. Hagkiss who stated that the total land, Imp. and machinery recorded by the Assessors as \$189170 was greatly in excess of 60% of their total capitalization. He felt the machinery value was fair and was not prepared to debate the value of the land as that was their raw product for making brick and tile. However, he felt that the building and plant value recorded as \$146,300 was excessive. The Company's capital investment figures were produced, also the total Insurance appraisal was submitted to the Court. Mr. Hawkins who had assessed the building and plan 4 years ago gave the detail of the appraisal at that time and the factor applied for 1955. Hadgkiss felt that the assessment was fair and reasonable at that time but the application of the multiplier on the original assessment was out of line as considerable of the original buildings were now not in use and should record no more than a scrap value as they were not part of the production unit. This was satisfactory to the Board and supported the evidence submitted. Imp. value was, ordered to be reduced to \$117,300.00. Although the reduced value was still in excess of 60% of total value Mr. Hadgkiss accepted the reduction without further protest for the year 1955.

Minutes of February 16th, 1955.

Reeve called the full Council to order at 8:00 p.m. on February 16th for a special meeting.

Mrs. Leif and Mrs. Crockett representing Whonock Memorial Hall were present and requested a grant or additional aid to take care of capital expense in major repair projects necessary to the building. It appeared that the roof had to be completely reshingled and a complete new chimney installed. Their expenditures were in the heighbourhood of \$350. The Reeve explained that this would establish a precedence and he felt that the result would be all the other Community Halls would follow with the same request. However he promised the delegation that their request would be considered when compiling the Municipal budget.

Bandmaster Fraser of the newly established Junior Band of Maple Ridge addressed the Council stating that the members of his Junior band from the ages of 8 to 11 years of age that the majority of them with the assistance of their parents had provided their own instruments so far. His endeavor to-night was to prevail upon the Council to assist him in financing the purchase of the drums and bass instruments. These he explained were no usually purchased by the members but owned by the Band Association as it could be readily seen they were no a very desirable or musical instrument to practice in the home. Council felt that these explanations were worthy and also his endeavor as an Association was worthy, the following motion was approved:

Moved by Coun. Wood and Simmonds: That the same grant of \$150.00 for the former Maple Ridge band to be diverted to the Maple Ridge Junior Band.

CARRIED

Mr. W. E. Anderson presented a subdivision plan of the United Church property on the corner of 6th and Trunk Road and also the remainder belonging to Mr. Setter. This was tentatively approved subject of course to the surveyor's plans being presented to comply with the sketch left on file.

Mr. Anderson also brought up the matter of Lots 15 & 16 on the west side of 7th Ave. between Selkirk and Menzies Street and particularly referred to the ravine that crossed these lots whichwould have to be filled. He felt that the Council should give some assistance in this matter. A discussion on the matter was delayed until Council and Foreman had inspected the property and investigated their responsibility in the matter.

Mr. McNutt offered the Council his equipment (Trucks and bull-dozers) at a very much reduced rate for the next three or four months if the Council could find work for them. He particularly instanced the Websters Corners Bridge fill which the Reeve explained to him was to be delayed for 2 or 3 years. He was informed at the present time there appeared to be nothing of major importance on our Works Programme that could take advantage of his offer, but his suggestion would definitely be kept in mind for future reference.

Commencing the agenda first letter was a notification of the North Fraser Valley Municipal Association meeting, New Westminster City Hall, at 8:00 p.m., Friday, February 18th. Most Councillors expressed the desire to attend.

Letters from the School District No. 42 asking for permission to negotiate a loan was dealt with the following motion:

Moved by Coun. Bailey and Dunlop: That the Council has no objection to the School Board negotiating a bank loan of 以40,000.00 to cover pre-budget financial requirements.

CARRIED

Also the receipt of the expenditure mx portion of their budget was acknowledged and tabled until its completion.

Minutes of February 16th, 1955 continued.

Motor Vehicle Branch, Victoria, requested by letter that our local office remain open the last Saturday of February for the issuing of car licences as a service to the public. This was agreed to.

The Community Planning Association of Canada's notification of an all day meeting Friday, March 4th, was read but unfortunately our regular monthly meeting was on the same date which the Council regretted. The Council were therefore unable to attend the Planning Board Meeting.

Maple Ridge Town Planning Commission had written to'say that the matter referred to them with reference to the Commercial zoning of the Lougheed Highway lots on the North end of the Carr Ave. had been considered and rejected as the Commission felt that the area in question had developed to a high standard as a residential area due to the protection forwarded by zoning and to relax this protection would not be fair to the neighbourhood. The Council after long discussion felt that Mr. E. B. Carr who had requested the change to Commercial should convass the immediate area within a 500 ft. radius and present to the Council a list of signatures in favour of such a change. The Council would then reconsider the matter.

The Town Planning Commission also submitted another request that the present area now zoned under Bylaw No. 226"A" be extended to a point 200 ft. 50%th of 22nd Road and in a westerly direction parallel to the 22nd to a point 200 ft. west of 3rd Ave. and then south to River Road. A discussion on this matter developed into a healthy expression of opinions from the Council members and was eventually tabled for further discussion.

Police report was read and filed.

The question was now brought up by the Clerk as to whether the same library tax should be confirmed as of previous years that of \$1.25. This was agreed to by all, but the following motion was passed:

Moved by Coun. Simmonds and Johnson: That war Weterans wifes be exempt from Library Tax, Who are under V.L.A. contract and cannot become joint owner.

Minutes of February 23rd, 1955

Full Council met in special meeting Wednesday, February 23rd at 8:00 p.m.

Maple Ridge Hospital Board headed by Chairman, Malcolm Brown, outlined to the Council their eagerness to consummate the purchase of the proposed site which was listed in the Bylaw at \$12,000. Apparently the Government were not prepared at this time to commit themselves to any financial assistance or any specified time when this would be available. The Chairman had also been advised by the Minister of Health that it was necessary for the Hospital Board to purchase the site and commence the project before any commitment would be made by the Government. This statement was news to the Council and if correct would contravene the intent of the Bylaw which provides funds by the sale of debentures to purchase a site and construct a hospital. If the minister's statement was correct that the Government would not assist in providing a site then they should not have approved the Bylaw in principle before going to the people as this purchase was specifically recorded and voted upon by the rate payers.

An hour of discussion ensued and the Reeve asked the delegation to retire until later in the evening as the meeting was called to deal with another matter which could not be delayed any longer.

Representatives of the Valley Gas Distributors Ltd. now entered and introduced themselves to the Reeve and Council. They stated they were representative of a number of Valley business men who had incorporated into a Company for the distribution of gas pipe lines for sale of gas direct to the consumer. This venture would require a large amount of capital both in preferred and common stock, but at the moment the initial step was to obtain a franchise from the Municipalities involved. The delegation was present to advise the Council that the franchise was being prepared for their consideration and they hoped that the Council would approve same and allow the rate payers to express their opinion on same. A number of inquiries were made on both sides and the matter was adjourned for further development upon presentation of their franchise. Their delegation retired and the Hospital representative again returned to the meeting and discussed the immediate purchase of the site.

It was evident to all concerned that it was necessary to contact Victoria for clarification on certain bylaw formalities and also to confirm the Governments statement that they would not participate in the punchase of a site. The Hospital Board would arrange a meeting with the officials of the three bodies concerned in the matter.

Letter was read from the Kinsman Club with reference to the purchase of certain lands between the Dewdney Trunk Road & Lougheed Highway for a proposed civic recreation area. Reeve informed the Councillors that this was a matter that would have to be stered individually and discussed at a lattermeeting.

Letter from the Maple Ridge Agricultural Ass'n. asking for a grant for the current year of \$500.00. Decision was delayed until the budget was discussed.

Moved by Coun. Johnson and Wood: That we purchase 1000 Roseo Marking Buttons at the cost of \$320.00 plus tax. (900 white & 100 yellow) CARRIED

Moved by Coun. Simmonds and Johnson: That the "Maple Ridge Indemnity Bylaw 1955 No. 390"A" be reconsidered, finally passed & adopted. CARRIED

Minutes of March 4th, 1955.

The regular monthly meeting commenced at 9:30 a.m. with the Reeve and Councillors Wood, Simmonds, Bailey and Johnson present.

Moved by Coun. Bailey and Simmonds: That the minutes of February 4th, 16th, and 23rd as circularized be adopted.

CARRIED

As no delegates were present a latter was read from J. & M. Omelk drawing the attention of the Reeve and Council to the erosion on the River frontage of his property which was a very serious matter and would eventually reach the River Road. Mr. Omelk asked that we continue to dump rock in the hopes that it would save his home from being carried away. All were sympathetic with the case and instructed the Clerk to notify the writer that the delay had been caused only by the breaking down of the old truck. A new truck had been purchased and was being fitted for work and the rock dumping would continue.

Delegation representing the Lions now entered the hall headed by Mr. Bennett. They were there to discuss the matter of the possibility of the Corporation purchasing a portion of the Carr property referred to in their letter of a previous week. The Reeve and Councillors all expressed their opinions and agreed in principle that in the interest of the whole district a public recreation centre should be made available for the peoples benefit, but all were not agreed on the particular site. The Reeve sugested that a committe consisting of the Council, Parks Board and service bodies should meet and consider all the sites that were available for this endeavor. The delegation retired with this to develop the idea further.

A letter was read from the Boy Scouts Ass'n. asking for a grant to be made in their favour, and this would be taken care of when the budget was brought down.

Council were notified from the Insurance Appraiser, J.M. Robertson Co., with reference to the damage to the Haney Garage Furnace room. The adjusters felt that there was no liability against this Corporation and if claim was made, we should refer it to them. It was ordered filed.

Request from the C.A.R.S. to have Council representation at their next meeting on March 14th. Councillors Wood and Bailey would attend.

Bill No. 12; an Act relating to highland drainage areas, was discussed at the request of the Reeve. The Reeve and Council were unanimous and approved the legislation in principle. The Clerk was to so notify the committe dealing with the matter.

Moved by Coun. Wood and Bailey: That the Clerk is authorized to expend \$2500 from Waterworks Account for the purpose of Fire hydrants and fittings.

A submission was made by the local Town Planning Commission with reference to commercializing the centre portion of the

town of Haney which read as follows:

'That recognizing the desirability of having available a larger area zoned to encourage centralization of commercial development without increasing the congestion on our through highways, the Commission wishes to extend the recommendations in our letter of Feb. 4th to include the suggestion that the commercial zone be extended to include all the area north of the Lougheed Highway to Dewdney Trunk Road between 6th and 8th Avenues, and also Lots 3,4,5,6,9,10 and 11, Plan 4558, and Lots 3,4, and 5, Plan 4499, D.L.398, Group 1.1 This was approved by motion of Simmonds and Wood.

Police report was read and filed.

The Ratepayers Assin. of Yennadon brought up again the matter of controlling their subdivisions of their area to two acre blocks. Councillor Simmonds would discuss the matter at the next Regional Planning Board meeting. The Clerk would then notify the Ratepayers Assin. to outline their area and canvass for signatures of owners agreeable to this their recommendations.

The Council requested the Clerk to write to the Regional Supervisor of Social Welfare at Chilliwack asking that they vacate the Municipal Offices not later than April the 30th. The matter was the outcome of a request from the Social Welfare Branch to give them more office space within the Municipal Hall building. As this was impossible they agreed to investigate the possibility to remove their quarters to another location.

The road foreman was now available. He brought up the matter of the fill that had been requested on the dead end of North Street. He felt that this job would not cost an exorbitant figure to complete and it would give a great service to the community in that lower area. All felt that he sould proceed with the job when time was available.

At the present time it appeared to be in too rough a state to carry out the races. The matter was to be taken up with Foreman, Mr. O. Lilley.

Minutes of April 1st, 1955.

The regular monthly meeting opened at 9:30 a.m., Friday, April 1st. Present were Reeve, Councillors Bailey, Simmonds, Johnson and Dunlop.

Delegation headed by Mrs. Ashworth, represented the Labour Progressive Party, interviewed the Council and presented their report prepared by their party with reference to the natural gas distribution in Municipal areas. The highlights of the report were touched by the speaker who on behalf of her party advocated public ownership. The Reeve explained that one of the difficulties would be piping gas into the Municipality and he felt that it was a great captal expenditure and a loss would occur having to pass through so much vacant land where no sale could take place. However, he and all the Council definitely would be in favour of public ownership if profits could accrue from such a venture. The matter was being considered by all Municipalities and at a later date further information would be to hand.

Mr. E. B. Carr asked for assurance that if he received a majority of signatures in favour of commercializing the lots owned by him fronting on Lougheed Highway would the Council commit themselves and advise him by letter that upon production of a petition the Council would commercialize the lots in question.

He was advised that a hearing was required to comply with the Town Planning Act.

Mr. J. Hadgkiss and W. Clappison, the Valley Natural Gas Distributors, Ltd., were present and outlined the progress of the company to date. The Reeve informed them of the receipt of the recommendation submitted by the previous delegation, the Labour Progressive Party, which would be considered before a decision was arrived/with regard a franchise being submitted to the ratepayers.

No further delegations.

The Reeve addressed the representatives asking them to state the reason for the formation of the local branch. Mr. Mercer replied to the Reeve saying that the men were only interested in fringe benefits and had no grievances at all to record of past treatment. They were now prepared to debate the proposed agreement item by The Reeve requested a shor recess for the Councillors who retired to discuss the matter between themselves. Returnin the the Meeting the Reeve explained that as the Council had received the list of debatable points only a matter of a few days ago, the Council were not inified and requested the meeting to be adjourned to a later date preferrably a night meeting. This was arranged for May 17th at 8:00 p.m. At this time the Council would be prepared to negotiate.

The meeting adjourned at 12:00 noon to convene again at 1:15 p.m.

The Council convened at 1:15 p.m. in company with representatives of the Valley Gas Distributors Ltd. Considerable discussion with regard to the transmission xframxMunkington gas transmission lines from Huntington to Vancouver followed resulting in the following motion:

Simmonds & Wood: Corporation of the District of Maple Ridge this 6th day of May, 1955 opposethe requested route variation of Westcoast Transmission Company Limited, whereby the so called lateral from Huntingdon to Vancouver be eliminated, and authorized Messrs. The meeting adjourned at 2:00 p.m. anticipating a meeting with all Municipal representatives at a later date.

Minutes of May 11th, 1955

A special meeting of the Maple Ridge Council convened on May 11th at 8:00 p.m. with all members present with the exception of Councillor Johnson, for the purpose of a hearing pursuant to The Maple Ridge Zoning Amending Bylaw No.394.

Mr. Tyson, heading a delegation was present, and addressed the Council enquiring as to the effect of the commercialization on property taxes. The delegation appeared to be in favour of the commercialization which was necessary in a growing community. The Reeve informed the speaker that although the lots within the area would be classified as commercial and would give the owners a selling value at a higher figure, the assessed values would not be immediately increased until commercial businesses were established. The delegation retired seemingly satisfied and registered no protest. The hearing would remain open until the close of the meeting. The Council now considered other municipal business.

A letter from Mrs. N. B. Harris was read in regard to the 17th Ave hill, asking for some protection from dust. The Council would enter this location on the list of roads to be oiled at a later date.

Mr. Gadsby requested the Council to grant him a building permit to erect a duplex dwelling on a commercial lot. The matter was to be referred to the Town Planning Commission.

The B. C. Telephone Co. had filed with the Council a copy of their submission to the Board of Transport Commissioners as telephone connections had now passed the 2500 bracket and steadily increasing. They petitioned the Commission to be classified into group 5 which allowed the telephone company to increase their rates. The submission entitled the Municipality or other governing body to register a protest as to the increase not later than 30 days after the date of receipt. The matter was tabled for further investigation.

Tenders for the purchase of timber on Lot 5 of Plan 5620 and SW_{\pm}^{1} of NW_{\pm}^{1} of Sec. 18, Tp.15, were now considered and the highest bid was accepted, which was presented by G.E. Savage Lumber Co. and the following motion was passed:

Coun. Dunlop and Bailey: That the tender of G. E. Savage Lumber Co. for standing and down timber on SWH of NWH of Sec.18, Tp.15 containing 40 acres. Lot 5 of Plan 5260, Sec.18, Tp.15 containing 10 acres for the sum of \$870.00. Certified cheque be accepted. 18 months allowed for removal of timber.

Councillor Simmonds was authorized to attend the Aviation Council Convention to be held at the Empress Hotel, Victoria on May 29th and 39th.

The matter of closing the ditch from 8th to 9th Avenues on the Dewdney Trunk Road was discussed and the Foreman's estimate of labour and material was in the amount of \$2270,000. This amount appeared to be higher than was expected and the matter was to be brought up again later.

Minutes of May 25th, 1955.

Special meeting held Wednesday, May 25th at 8:00 p.m. Present were the Reeve and Councillors Johnson, Simmonds, Wood and Dunlop.

Mr. Featherstonhaugh was in attendance and reported that the building inspector had visited his property on 20th road and had condemned the use of the dwelling until necessary toilet facilities were installed. Mr. Featherstonhaugh requested a period of time in order to allow him to do this work as it necessitated the building of an addition to the house before the plumbing could be installed. He asked for a period of 2 months. After considerable discussion as to why the job could not be done sooner, the Council approved his request.

The Reeve reported that he had been approached by representatives of the Peace Counsel who asked for permission to use a car with a loud speaker installed on June the 4th. Considerable debate followed and as permission had been given to previous community bodies, it was felt that the Reeve could inform the Peace Counsel that their request would be granted providing they did not create a public nuisance with their speaker and also no propaganda particularly of a political nature.

Clerk reported that Mr. McGregor of Trunk Road East had requested that the promised work of clearing up the boulevard fronting his property be commenced without further delay. As the Road Foreman's programme was particularly full at the present time there was no alternative but to leave this work over until after the hard surface work had been completed.

Councillor Wood brought up the matter of the breakage of the water line on 20th Road and recommended that cast iron pipe approximately 100' long should replace the old wooden pipe, also a crib should be constructed on the south of the road to safeguard both the road and the water line which at this point crosses a deep ravine. The foreman would investigate the situation.

Complaints had been made with reference to equipment being left on the boulevard of Menzies St. West. It was believed to belong to Mr. W. Minty. Clerk was to no inform him to remove same from the road allowance.

Minutes of May 25th, 1955- Continued.

Clerk brought up the matter of a spare stenographer to be employed, particularly to complete the addressograph work. Councillor Dunlop recommended that if the job was to be permanent, applications to be called for. As this was the usual practice for permanent positions all felt that it was not necessary when the employment may be not of a permanent nature.

Reeve reported that he had met Professor Knop and assistants relative to the gravelling of the U.B.C. road which would be of a shareable basis with the Municipality. Approval was given by the Council to make the best possible agreement. The matter was left to his attention.

Reeve reported on his return from Ottawa that the Board of Transport hearing relative to the Natural Gas, a submission by the West coast Co. had carried over for two days and we would be notified later as to the finding. He outlined the salient points but was not in a position to give an opinion of the results at this time.

Meeting adjourned 10:55 p.m.

Minutes of June 3rd, 1955

Present were the Reeve and Councillors Bailey, Dunlop and Johnson. The regular monthly meeting opened with the approval of the prior month's minutes.

Moved by Coup. ABailey and Dunlop: That the minutes of May 4th, 6th, 11th and 25th as circularized be adopted.

Old-age pensioner, Leppennen, of Trunk "oad requested the Council's assistance in regard to a water connection. Council decided to deal with it in the usual manner and left the decision to the Waterworks Committee.

Mr. A.A. Staub asked for assistance from the Council in providing culverts on 25th Avel North of 30th Road. He would then gravel the road. He was informed that this would be given but the extension of the road any further than this would have to be dealt with after investigation and inspection. Mr. Staub is located on Legal Subdivision 8, the old Dalrymple place.

Delegation headed by E. Zirk of 22nd Road East of 14th Ave. proposed to install a $l\frac{1}{2}$ " water line to their properties on the east end of the road from 14th Ave. at their costs with permission from the Council. The waterworks Committee would investigate the matter as we feel that the $l\frac{1}{2}$ " line would be inadequate, and not tie in with our general water line installation plan. Report would be brought in at the next meeting.

Mr. Langston also was present and asked for procedure as far as installing water lines through his subdivision off Dewdney Trunk Road. He also felt that a small diameter line was all that was necessary. Water works Committee would also investigate this road and report back.

Mrs. Sproson complained of her property being flooded from the run-off from our road-ditch and that this could be avoided if we continued the ditch to a culvert east of her property. As the Reeve had inspected the situation earlier in the day, he thought that the request was reasonable and ordered this to be taken care of by the foreman and works crew.

Minutes of June 3rd, 1955, Continued.

Request was made by Mr. Setter, property owner at the corner of 6th Ave. and Dewdney Trunk Rd. for 6th Avenue N. to be included in the hard surfacing programme. His complaint was primarily due to the dust hazard which was, to use his own expression, "beyond endurance." The Reeve explained that 6th Ave. N. was not in condition for hard surfacing in this year's programme, but at a later date it may be entered under those roads that were proposed to be oiled. He also complained of an increase of \$80.00 in taxes. This was explained by the fact that his property was now less than 5 acres and had forfeited the limitedassessment on farm properties. His assessment had now been equalized to agree with all surrounding properties. If he objected to this his recourse was to complain at the Court of Revision next spring.

Correspondence now dealt with a request from Alouette Private Hospital that what the Corporation black-topped 32nd Road they include his entrance to the Hospital receiving door. He was quite willing to pay the full cost of this. Clerk was to reply that the cost would be \$\dipperpoonup 6.00 per ton \$\textbf{t}aid.

Greater Vancouver and Lower Mainland Labour Counsel advised the Council that on Saturday, June 8th at 9:00 a.m. at the Labour Temple, 307 W. Broadway, a meeting would be held relative to the B.C. Electric's application to the B.C. Public Utilities Commission with a right to distribute Natural Gas. Representation from all municipalities was solicited. The Reeve requested that this matter be tabled for the time being in order to contact other municipalities who may decide to send a Committee to represent all instead of individual representation.

A letter was acknowledged from Andy Marc wherein he acknowledged his approval of the contemplated repairs to the road into the University section. As this road traversed his property he agreed to the proposals as recommended as long as the road was not gazetted.

Tenders for the purchase of timber on Lots 5 & 6, SE¹, Sec. 27, Tp. 12, were now considered and the contract was awarded to the highest bidder, Mr. Joe St. Jean, for the sum of \$500 provided this amount was paid to the Corporation before commencement.

Moved by Coun. Bailey and Dunlop: That the tender of Mr. Joe St. Jean for the timber on Lots 5 & 6 of Sec. 27, SE4, Plan 12 for the amount of \$500 be accepted. One year for removal, cheque with bid.

Notice from the North Fraser Valley Health Unit for a meeting to be held in Cloverdale on June 15th at 2:00 p.m. relative to the Provincial meat inspection and the appointment of a full time inspector of fur farms. This was turned over to the Committee for the North Fraser Valley Health Centre. Also Regional Planning Board advised the Council of a meeting on yesterday's date which of course could not be attended.

Police report was read and filed.

Mr. MacPherson representing the B.C. Telephone Co. was present to discuss and explain the submissions presented by the Telephone Co. to the Board of Transport Commissioners. Also present was representation of the Board of Trade, Mrs. V. Cameron, Mr. G. Mowatt and H. Holland, who were interested in the matter. Mr. MacPherson answered the questions presented by the Reeve and Council, and then addressed all present and explained the procedure of the requirements when making submissions to the Transport Board at Ottawa. It was not quite clear as to why increase in the rates structure should follow the increase in telephone connections. It was assumed by all that greater volume of business always resulted in greater revenue. Mr. MacPherson stated that this was not the case in the telephone situation as always when telephone connections developed, a greater service was given to all. Due to the expansion and the principle before the Board of Transport Commissioners that rates were based on actual cost and that greater the extensions, that the tie-up with new exchanges wx that normally would develop gave the original owner of km connection a greater service and the capital needed to make these expansions had to be derived from the rate structure. As this explanation appeared to be satisfactory to all after a great deal of explanation and cross-questioning, Mr. MacPherson and the delegation retired. Reeve explained to the Board of Trade delegation developments so far in regard to the Lougheed Highway retaining wall and the fill that would follow immediately. The sidewalk, however, would be delayed until next year in order that the gravel would settle. He explained that this was agreed by all engineers concerned both Government and Municipal.

Road Foreman, Mr. Lilley, was now present and discussed with the Council the installation of catch basins on the fill on Lougheed Highway, and the clearing of bush and stumps on the Gilker Hill Road off Kanaka Creek.

Councillor Johnson reported that the crusher needed new bearings and sleeves.

Minutes of June 16th, 1955.

Full Council met in special meeting the 16th of June at 8:00 p.m. As there were a number of delegations present on different matters, Mr. Legness who had recently purchased property on Powerline Road was heard first. His request was to have a stump removed on the boulevard in front of his newly purchased property, and was quite willing to carry out the work himself but did not wish to assume the responsibility of not damaging the waterline. Council promised him co-operation and would visit the spot and review the situation.

Mr. McNutt headed a delegation who felt that the Council should oppose the monopoly entering the Public Utility field in the Fraser Valley. He was referring to the distribution and sale of gas, and he requested that support should be given to a new firm that was also endeavouring to get the franchise. The Reeve explained that he was the appointed delegate of the Municipality of the Fraser Valley and his committee had explained all angles of the question which would take hours of time to explain and as there were many other delegations waiting to meet the Council, he felt that this was not the time to do it. However he was to meet the elected representatives of the Fraser Valley as a whole on June 24th who will consider the matter and act collectively. Delegation retired.

A lengthy petition was presented by taxpayers of 25th Ave. North from 30th Road. Many of them were present and they were appealing to the Council for the hard surfacing of both roads. They felt that the dust hazard had arisen to such a point that it was impossible to live there unless something was done. This was caused by the heavy trucks moving in and out of the new prison site. The Council were very sympathetic and would approach the Provincial Government with a view to getting assistance immediately.

Another delegation from 22nd Road running East of 25th Ave. complained of the deploreable state of 22nd East. The condition was such that heavy trucks ould not deliver gravel in there till dry weather, however, the foreman would investigate the situation.

Mr. Skippen of 15th Road East of 30th again brought up the matter of continuing the road to his property line. The question involved the granting of lang for the extension of 15th Road across the creek. And as Mr. Ashworth had already promised to donate a certain width, Mr. Skippen would also consider the matter and notify the Council by letter if he was willing to do the same.

Mr. Bruce of Silver Valley Heights asked permission to erect a sign at the corner of 8th Ave. and Lougheed Highway. The sign was to be a directional pointer to his property to the north signifying that a turn was to be made in that direction. The Council felt they would not commit themselves in this matter as others would ask for the same consideration, and road signs are not erected for private purpose.

Mr. Lowry who resides at the corner of 5th Ave. and Dewdney Trunk Rd. informed the Council that this day he had applied for a permit to build a garage and filling station on that spot and that the permit had not been issued until the matter was reviewed by the Council. The Clerk now read a petition from residents surrounding the corner who were asking for the area to be zoned as residential. As this opposition to commercializing the corner was now present, it would appear that the decision would rest with the property owners. In the meantime Mr. Lowry's application for a permit would be delayed until the zoning question was settled. Council had no objection to Mr. Lowry petitioning the area himself.

Mr. Findlay of 25th Ave. North and neighbours were present and asked for a ditch to be installed along the road in order to eleviate the flooding of their land. This was also referred to the foreman for review.

Minutes of June 16th, 1955, Continued.

Correspondence was now dealt with: B.C. Electric Co., Valley Natural Gas and the Labour Progressive Party, all had presented written matter on the gas distribution question which had reached all members of the Council and therefore was tabled as read.

A letter from the B.C. Farmers Institute complimenting the Council on their stand relative to the increase of the B.C. Telephone rates was read and filed.

A road extension on 26th Ave. North of 16th Rd. was asked for by Murray Siddons. The Reeve reported that this was on his list of road extensions which he was to visit in company with the foreman in a few days. He would report on the matter later when further information was available.

Laboratory report was read and filed.

A petition was on hand signed by the plumbers of Maple Ridge asking that the Council set up a Board of Examination to qualify the competency of plumbers operating in Maple Ridge. Clerk was to reply that this was beyond the powers of the Corporation and that our local Plumbing Bylaw takes care of the situation by setting the standard of and the quality of installations in Maple Ridge. And it was the inspectors duty to see that these work requirements were carried out and that inspector's approval or disapproval dealt with the whole situation. In other words the installation had to be installed in workman like manner.

Another petition was presented from Robert Russell and others, corner of 2nd Ave. and 17th Road for drainage and continuation of the road from 17th through to Lougheed Highway. Councillors Wood and Dunlop would bring in a report on the matter with the assistance of the foreman.

Councillor Wood had received an inquiry from a Mr. Berube from 14th Ave. North with reference to extension of water line. As the whole matter of the Yennadon area was taken up at ratepayers meetings for that district, and that we were awaiting further water developments from the north he would be informed, but the matter was still under consideration.

Councillor Dunlop had received a letter from Mr. Robert Russell requesting a shallow ditch be installed close to the road, 3' from his property. Councillor Dunlop would visit Mr. Russell and investigate his wishes in the matter.

Minutes of June 30th, 1955

As the Dominion Holiday of July 1st occurred on the first Friday in July, the regular monthly meeting date of the Council met on June 30th at 6:00 p.m. with all present.

First attention was given to Mr. E. B. Carr whose problem was the commercializing of his two lots numbers \$\infty\$ & \$\frac{1}{8}\$ at the north end of Carr Ave., Lougheed Highway. As the Council were now ready to submit a Zoning Extension Bylaw to a point 200' west of 3rd Ave. with a provision to commercialize a ribbon each side of Lougheed Highway. Mr. Carr was informed by the Reeve that his request would be decided by the result of the hearing given to the new Zoning Extension Bylaw which would be held at a later date after the advertisements had appeared in the press. Mr. Carr retired.

The next speaker was Mr. Moore who complained of the delay im approving his subdivision plan. The plan in question had been presented to the Council by the surveyor, Mr. V. Edge, two or three weeks ago. Council had not approved the plan as the road had not been gravelled or a security deposit made. Mr. Edge took the plan away to inform his client that this was necessary. Mr. Moore had called at the hall demanding approval of his plan. He was informed that this could not be dealt with until it was again presented to the Council and that our requirements as laid down in our Roads Subdivision Bylaw had been complied with or a security deposit made which would be estimated by the road foreman. He was not satisfied with this answer and would attend the next Council meeting on June 30th. The Reeve informed Mr. Moore of the procedure required for approval of plans and that the Foreman's estimate was \$211.00. A difficult situation followed in attempting to convince him that our requirements were reasonable, but it was quite evident that he was not ready to accept Municipal regulations and that he would estimate the road requirements and not the Foreman. The Reeve explained that the Council must support the Foreman's estimate of the security deposit necessary which would be returned to Mr. Moore immediately he had completed the road pursuant to Bylaw requirements. Mr. Moore was not satisfied and left the hall.

No other delegations present, the June minutes were approved by the following motion:

Moved by Coun. Bailey and Dunlop: That the minutes of June 3rd, 16th, & 23rd as circularized be adopted.

Representative Sprys of Jyro-copic, parking meters, entered the Council chamber and asked permission to present his recommendations to install parking meters in Haney on a free trial basis for one year. Corporal Calvert, the Chairman of the Traffic Committee was also present and supported the idea of a one year trial. Considerable *** detail of the plan was explained to the Council but it was apparent that all were not in favour, but were willing to accept a majority decision. The matter was tabled to be thoroughly investigated by the Parking Committee who would bring in a report.

A delegation headed by Mr. Lester and Livesey now called on the Council to discuss the Youth Centre building, its repair and future use. The delegation present offered a suggestion that in their opinion the present Youth Building which was situated on the Civic Centre property should not be repaired but should be turned over to a Civic Centre Recreation Committee which was now being completed. The membership of the Committee would be from three elected bodies and all Community organizations who would formulate a master recreation building plan for the Civic Centre. The question presented to the Council at this time was would the Council forego or release any and all financial interests in the Youth Centre Building and could the Committee which was now before the Council feel that the disposition of the building was their responsibility for the time being. Reeve and Council informed the delegation that they were willing to release their financial responsibility in

the matter but doubted very-much their title to moral ownership as the building had been moved on to Municipal property and left there and it was quite possible the original subscribers that purchased the building may ask for some form of compensation if disposed of, and this was a matter that the newly formed Committee would have to investigate. No further delegations, correspondence was dealt with. Letter read from the Whonock Rate Payers Asson. asking for certain road work to be carried out was to be referred to the foreman.

Letter from the Department of Public Works (Federal) notified the Council they were now ready to repair the Wharf at Haney. But before any expenditures could be made the foreshore must be reserved for public use in the name of the Department: The following motion was recorded:

Letter from Lawyer A.K. Thompson relative to the right of way road on Lot 3, SW of 16, Tp.12, stated that his client would post a notice khxk saying private road, trespassers will be prosecuted. Clerk would take the matter up with Corporation Lawyers, Bull, Tupper, Houser, Ray, requesting kkx a legal opinion on the matter as considerable public funds had been spent on this road in the past.

Police report was read and filed.

Petition from the ratepayers on 19th Road asking for ditches to be dug, plus widening and gravelling was considered reasonable and was referred to the foreman for attention.

Petition from ratepayers on Powerline Road between 2nd and 3rd asking for immediate attention for the hard surfacing of the road which was badly in need of repair. Foreman reported that this road had now been patched up and repaired and was now in good condition. Clerk was to reply to the petitioners notifying them of this attention.

Louis Nieson presented a claim for compensation for the loss of 75 turkeys by dogs or other animals. This was supported by written confirmation from Con. V.N. Morris. The matter was left over for the attention of the full Council.

The Queens Contest Committee Secretary, Marjorie Kershaw, of the Canadian Legion #88 asked for permission to place a banner over 8th ave. in the vicinity of Menzies Street in order to advertise their candidate for Miss Blueberry. This was granted and the Clerk was to notify.

Bylaw 406"A" was given its final reading by motion as follows:

Mr. Robson, Provincial Inspector of Electrical Energy now entered the hall and addressed the Council on the policy of the Provincial Government relative to electrical inspections of the Correctional Institute, and at great length explained that the Municipality had no right to charge fees or inspect installations on Provincial lands. He informed us that the fuling of their legal Dept. that the Crown and their servants and all contractors operating on Crown property were exempt from all Municipal permits. Reeve replied that he was quite aware that the Crown and their servants were exempt from taxation, etc., but it was news to him that contractors who were Exemp not Crown servants were also given the exemption. He informed Mr. Robson that at all times it was the endeavor of Council to co-operate with the Provincial Departments but felt there should be some legal clarification embodied in the Municipal Act that legalizes such an exemption to contractors. Clerk was to refer the matter to our lawyer for a legal opinion.

Foreman, 0.W. Lilley was present and reported that he was ready to start the grader hard surfacing programme to-morrow, Friday. All the contract hard surfacing work was now completed and he submitted a list of all the road and tonage laid on each. Clerk was to make copies and provide each Councillor with same.

Councillor Bailey asked the foreman for attention on 25th Ave. South adjacent to the Shimek property. Foreman reported that it would be necessary to acquire some footage from the owner in order to widen the road. Councillor Bailey and Foreman would investigate Shimek's.

Foreman also reported the very poor shape of the portion of road on the Pitt Meadows end of Maple Ridge which was badly broken up and in his opinion was not in shape to repair. He would report again later on the matter.

The Reeve now reported on the Committee meeting with the Union Workers and their representatives. Apparently they were not satisfied with the agreement that was submitted by the Municipality and recommended 4 or 5 changes in same. The detail of the matter was discussed but left over for the attention of the full Council to be held at 2 o'clock next Wednesday afternoon. Clerk was to notify the local Union members to postpone their Wednesday night meeting with the Council until Thursday night as the Reeve had discovered that he had a previous commitment for Wednesday night which he could not postpone.

A short discussion arose over the sale of an established mink ranch and whether the new owner could continue to operate. As it was new 12 p.m. the solving of the matter was left to a later date.

Meeting adjourned.

Minutes of July 20th, 1955

The Reeve and full Council convened at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 20th, at a special meeting of the Council.

Mr. C. White of White's Grocery Store was in attendance and expressed his opinion that inequality was present with reference to trade licence fees. He recommended that trade licence fees for outside country small stores should definitely be less than large stores operating in Haney. The Council was very definite there was reason present to charge greater fees to those businesses doing a greater volume of trade. However, a new Bylaw was in process of being prepared and the whole matter would be considered.

Mrs. Blackstock and Mr. Lloyd Whitebone, Trustees of the School Board, asked the Council for some protection and assistance in reserving new sites for future school buildings. The Reeve pointed out that the Council only had control over municipal lands where titles were exvested in the name of the Corporation and therefore could not open the matter, only to suggest to private owners that sub-divisions ward presented for approval & that the School Board may be interested in same.

The claim for loss of turkeys by Mr. Louis Neison was again considered and as a policy of the Council to pay only 50% of a resonable value, it was considered that \$4.70 each was a fair price for unaress and un-picked turkeys, three months old. Therefore, the following motion was approved:

Moved by Coun. Bailey and Dunlop: That Mr. Louis Nieson be reimbursed the sum of \$176.25 for the loss of (75) turkeys. \$2.35 a piece.

The petition from residents of 18th Avenue, which was tabled from the last meeting, was again considered. Clerk was to inform the petitioners that the Council did not feel justified in zoning the area after the mink ranch had been established. However, new owners would be advised that the Mink Bylaw Regulations would be rigidly enforced.

It was brought to the attention of the Council that the petitioners of 16th Avenue were eager to see some commencement of the work promised in the Spring. The Clerk was to reply that the work was on the current years agenda and would be attended to before the close of the year. In the meantime, 16th Avenue had been oiled.

Mr. Walter Best presented an plan for approval as per the following motion:

Councillor Bailey asked for 18th Avenue South to be graded and was recorded in the foreman's work book.

The reason for calling this special meeting was now considered and a long discussion followed with a reference to the request made by Municipal Workers Local No. 662 and at 4:30 p.m. the Council had agreed on the five items that were controversial.

The Labor Committee of the Council would be meeting with the representative of the workers on Thursday Evening and present same.

The full Council met for the August monthly meeting at 9:30 a.m. Friday, August 5th.

Joe Alaksa of the River Road, requested the Council for assistance in making a short fill for the continuation of Haney Street in order to give him an access to his lots. The Council promised to visit the location early this afternoon and review the situation.

The Advertising Manager of the Gazette asked for a conformation from the Council for approval of a three column page advertisement with reference to the Agricultural Association 50th Anniversary. The Approximate cost would be 22:00 or 23.00. Approval was given.

A representive of the Diking and Drainage Board, now working in Pitt Meadows, recommended to the Council that the drainage ditch running adjacent to the Linblad property south of the C.P.R. tracks be also cleaned out while the machinery was in that area. Councillor Woods and Dunlop were appointed as a committee to investigate the need of same with authority to order the work to be done if necessary.

Correspondence dealt with: Notice from the Fraser Valley Lunicipal Association to have a meeting on August 24, at 8 p.m. at the City Hall, New Westminster. It was recorded to have a Councillor present.

A letter from the Yorkshire Corporation Limited which had taken over the insurance business of the Robert Day Company, Limited. Clerk was to notify the company that they were approved to carry on our business covered by the prior firm, R.J. Day.

The B.C. Game Commission notified the Council that with reference to their application for water rights of the North Alouette River, they would have no objection as long as a water shed area was not developed.

As it was now 10 a.m. the meeting reconvened into a hearing for Zonging Bylaw No. 407"A".

A large body of complainants were present who protested by petition that the area each side of the Lougheed Highway from Carrs Hill Road west to 3rd Avenue be zoned residential and not commercial. The petition included almost all of the residents fronting on Lougheed Highway.

Mr. Brisbois and Mr. Scherct, of the Maple Ridge Motor Court, spoke in defence of commercialization. Mr. L.C. Carr and Mr. William Brown were in attendance but did not express an opinion.

Another delegation represented the 5th Avenue corner area and also presented a long petition objecting to the four corners being zoned commercial.

A letter was also read from Mr. J. Hadgkiss recommending if the ribbon along Lougheed Highway was to be classified as commercial that the commencement point be extended farther west and continue westerly to 3rd Avenue. This debatable question was carried on until 11 a.m.

As no further complaints were recorded, the petitioners left the hall, leaving the question in the hands of the Council.

The lists of petitioners names woulde be investigated and the Clerk would bring them back for further consideration.

As the hearing was closed for the time being, the Council resumed their correspondence.

The claim was read from R. S. Sommerville, asking for compensation for loss of chickens killed by dogs. Also, another claim was submitted by Nick Radair for loss of one sheep caused by dogs. Also the Woods Turkey Farm submitted a claim for the loss of 47 turkeys. The three claims were dealt with by the following motions:

Moved by Councillor Bailey and Dunlop that Mr. R. F. Summerville be reimburded the sum of \$7.00 for the loss of nine birds.

CARRIED

Moved by Councillor Simmonds and Woods that Nick Re da be paid the sum of \$11.00 for the loss of one sheep.

CARRIEL

Moved by Councillor Bailey and Dunlop that Mr. J. Woods be reimbursed the sum of \$97.80 for the loss of 47 turkeys.

CARRIED

Mr. Hansen, Representing the Retail Merchants Association, supported by a petition signed by a majority of store keepers expressed their opinion towards the instalment of parking metres. All signatures were recorded in the column against parking metres and none for parking metres. Apparently, those in favour of parking metres had not been canvassed.

The whole thing was tabled until recommendations came from the parking committee.

Letter from J. E. DeWolf, complaining bitterly of cars parked in front of his store for long periods, thus violating the one hour parking signs erected in that area and asking that either the R.C.M.P. or someone representing authority to enfore the provision of the parking area and thus giving him protection. This letter was also tabled for immediate development.

Mr. Lee of 22nd Avenue, South asked for assistance in tapping water to his green house at the foot of 22nd Avenue, South. His requirements were, $l^{\frac{1}{2}}$ inch pipe, which he would purchase if the Corporation would dig the ditch with their machinery. As he would be a large user of water, supplemented by a few connections on each side of the road, the matter was to be referred to the foreman as to the question of providing this help of pipe digging.

Mr. Zirk, or 22nd Road, South of 14th Avenue, also brought up the matter of contributions from the Council towards the establishment of a new line. It was impressed upon him by the Reeve that the usual policy was available, that is the Colora from contributes 25% towards the cost of a new line and these costs would be provided to Mr. Lirk by the Clerk.

A request was made to the Council to approach the B.C. Electric with a view to establish a light at Lougheed and 5th Avenue. Clerk was ordered to investigate the cost of same.

The foreman reported his progress towards the opening of the new garbage dump, south of the Trunk Road and he hopes to have this completed in the early part of the week.

Councillor Simmonds recommended that the roads through the cemetery be oiled without delay. The foreman was authorized to spend up to \$100 to carry out this work immediately.

Councillor Woods brought up the matter of oiling 4th Avenue, which had been promised and was again confirmed. He also referred to the matter of burying dead dogs or animals hurt by the traffic on the highway.

Councillor Dunlop refered to the heavy growth of weeds on the McMyn sub-division. The Council having no bylaw to take care of the destruction of same, nothing could be done about the matter.

Councillor Bailey referred to the matter of a culvert on 15th Road west of 30th Avenue and also the matter of road allowance on 29th Avenue running into the Macata property.

The Reeve reported that the grader could take care of most of the trouble and that no hard surfacing would be done this year.

Mr. Fred Little requested to the Council to sell him one load of crushed gravel for a special job that he had to undertake and he offered \$2.00 per yard for same. The Council agreed to accept this xxxxx price. Apparently Mr. Little's need for this gravel was due to the fact of the small crush.

Councillor Simmonds, on behalf of the Parks Board, asked for approval from the Council to establish a play ground sign in and around Maple-Ridge Park. This was granted and the Clerk was to take the matter up with the R.C.M.P.

Report was also by made by the Reeve and Councillor Simmonds with reference to the acquisition of a small Albion play ground by the Parks Board.

The opening of 27th Avenue, south of the Trunk Road was not considered favorable at this time. This was in answer to a request made by Mestrs Savage and Nichols.

A letter from the Local Workers Union was read and a committee would meet the workers committee tonight at 8 p.m.

Full Council met on August 22nd for a special meeting.

Mr. E. Adair, Jr. was present and wished to make an offer for the purchase of a municipally owned lot 5, 398, Group 1, Plan 4499, which is situated adjacent to the Municipal Civic Centre. The Council felt that this lot should be advertised for sale and the Clerk was so advised. The matter would be again discussed when offers were received. The Reeve now reported the situation with regard to the marking rocking of the Albion River banks in an attempt to contraol erosion. The understanding was that the Government would pay for 5000 yards of rocks at \$1.00 per yard. Our truckers were engaged in this work at the present time. Accounts would be submitted in due course.

The Reeve reported that Mr. Kirpatrick had roughly 200 yards of broken concrete that he would also like to dump in the river. It was left with the Reeve to take care of this program as to whether this should be added into the \$5,000 total.

The Reeve instructed that the No. 13 Road (Holland Dyke) should be entered into the foreman's book for grading.

As the Reeve would be absent at the Regular Monthly Meeting, September 2nd, due to the Mayors and Reeves Convention at Edmonton, and would be leaving by August 27th, he appointed Councillor J. Simmonds as Acting Reeve.

The matter of the Ollenburger ditch was brought up again by the Reeve. It was agreed that the situation should be reviewed again with the possibility of completing the work.

The Reeve advised the Councillors of the Wednesday night meeting at New Westminster at 8:00 P.M. He also brought up the matter that we should seriously consider the appointing of a special policeman to enforce parking regulations. He felt that at least we should consider this before any decision be made in regard to parking metres. As Corporal Calvert, chairman of the Traffic Committee was away for a few days, the matter was left to his return and a meeting with the Traffic Committee.

Councillor Woods brought up the question of truckers picking up and deliverying goods without first obtaining a licence. Reports have been made to him that this was happening and the Clerk was instructed to look into the matter.

Councillor Simmonds again referred to the purchase of a small portion of land in Albion that could be dedicated in use for park or play groud purposes. He instantces a small portion of the Ritchie property at a price in the neighborhood of \$350.00. The Council felt that the matter should be referred to the Parks Board first, who would meet on Friday, August 26.

Councillor Simmonds, with the support of George Bailey, recommended that the rough portion of the new cemmetery be ploughed and seeded to grass.

Also the Cemmetery Committee were looking into the matter of the estimated number of grave plots available that could be sold to the I.O.O.F.

It was also recommended that \$10 extra should be paid to the two cemmetery care-takers for exhuming the remains of a decomposed body, last week.

Councillor Dunlop asked for grader work on Lorne Road and also to level out the new dug ditch on the Lindblad property. He asked the Council to visit the drainage problem east of 2nd Avenue on the Sloan property. He felt that this had been aggravated by drainage from the gold course. Also that the new new road which had been recently graveled west of 1st Avenue, adjacent to the Haliday home, should be leveled out and the connecting road from 17th Road to Lougheed Highway should be brushed.

Councillor Wood again brought up the matter of hard surfacing Carr Hill at the end of the River Road.

A long discussion took place with reference to hard surfacing the cut for roads in the Mountain View Sub division. It was decided to leave this project until next year, since considerable work had been done in the neighborhood already.

Councillor Johnson recommended that the sidewalk on the Trunk Road should be commenced without delay and also the widening of 16th Avenue, North which had been recommended in the early Spring. Now that the hard surface work was almost completed, he felt that these two jobs should have priority.

Councillor Johnson also recommended that Mr. Nagai's request for water should be again investigated.

No further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:15 P.M.

Minutes September 2nd, 1955, continued

The Foreman reported that he had measured the requirements needed in the purchase of land from Mr. Shimmiek. The amount to be in the neighborhood of a quarter of an acre or slightly less. Councillor Bailey would contact the owner and discuss with him what would be a reasonable offer.

Councillor Johnson reported on the necessity of installing a new culvert on 22nd Road.

Councillor Dunlpp mentioned the matter of removing trees on 21st Road.

The Foreman reported with reference to the lane running from 17th Road to Lougheed Highway. He felt that the culver would be a Provincial responsibility, therefore, the Clerk would write to the Public Works Department, New Westminster, regarding same.

Mr. Inglee was present at this moment and reported that the Foreman had blocked the frontage for the full length of his property. The Foreman reported that this was only of a temporary nature, and Mr. Inglee would be given access to his property without delay.

Messrs Lester and Dickie entered tha hall, representing the Civic Centre Committee and recommended to the Council that they should not dispose of the lot offered for tenders, being Lot 5 of 398, dealt with earlier in the meeting, until the Civic Centre had reported more fully on their future plans for the Civic Centre Site. Acting Reeve Simmonds notified the delegation that the matter had been tabled until the next meeting.

Councillor Wood, Chairman of the Water Committee, recommended that we pay the Water Rights Department the necessary fees to obtain a licence to draw water from the North Alouette River. He also felt that the Water Committee should continue its investigation as to a greater supply and therefore he moved the following motion:

A special meeting of the Council convened at 8:00 p.m., September 14, present were the Reeve, Councillors, Simmonds, Johnson, Bailey and Dunlop.

A Delegation was present. Mr. Ferguson and Mr. Whiting represented the residents of 29th Avenue. Mr. Ferguson addressed the Council, presenting a petition signed by all owners. The petition embodied nine items dealing with bulldozing, widening, grading, filling, graveling and hard surfacing of 29th Avenue. The petitioners felt little or no work had been done on the road for many years and that they were entitled to a fair share of the public works expenditures. The Reeve and Councillors agreed that the road was in bad condition and it was only of twenty foot width. Mr. Ferguson drew their attention to detail in the petition that the owners were willings to donate the required width. The Reeve informed the speaker that item six, which referred to immediate hard surfacing, could not be dealt with this year, as hard surfacing could not be laid on the road until it had settled. The delegation was promised consideration and the foreman would investigate and report fully on all items asked for.

The next delegation was Messrs. 2 Nilson and Glenn. They requested the Council to provide crossings or fill in the ditch in fromt—of their new subdivision on the corner of 21st Avenue and Dewdney Trunk Road. The subdivision plan had provided the Corporation with and additional twenty feet width to the Trunk Road. The Reeve explained that this definitely did not obligate the Council in having to widen the road widthhneither to provide crossings at public expense. The Council agreed to visit the location on the following day at 1:00 p.m. and review the whole situation.

Mr. George Mussallem was the next delegate, with reference to the newly installed parking sign at Seventh Avenue. He certainly objected to this, as it was detrimental to his business of owning and operating a large garage and service station. He felt this effected his customers, the right to park adjacent to his business and therefore asked for the sign to be removed. The sign was erected the day before in the wrong place, therefore the clerk was ordered to see to it's removal by informing the foreman to do so, and the parking committee would then review and report their recommendations in that area.

Mrs. Blackstock entered the Hall and asked for information regarding the installation of the water line south of 13th Avenue. The Reeve informed her she could obtain the information and detail from the office staff. She also complained about stumps being left on 8th Avenue boulevard, in front of her property. This matter would be taken up with the road foreman.

Mr. Lee of 37th Avenue and 14th complimented the Council on grading his road. Unfortunately, however there was not sufficent gravel to grade, therefore the clay bed had been exposed in many places with the result of having difficulty in getting into his place. He requested more gravel to be laid on the road. This request was to be entered into the foreman's book:

No more delegations, the correspondence was dealt with.

CORRESPONDENCE

A letter from Retail Merchants Association which asked for purchases whenever possible to be made from local merchants, was read and noted. Clerk noted that this was always the policy all things being equal.

Health Unit Laboratory Report. Read and filed.

Police Report, read and filed.

A letter from the North Shore Highway Association of their meeting September 21, was turned over to Councillor Dunlop to represent the Council.

Letter from G. Savage Lumber Company; relative to the timber cutting rights he had purchased from the Corporation on Municipal land on 27th Avenue south. He found that it is impossible to enter the property from 27th Avenue, and had now bulldozed an entrance from 28th Avenue. A sketch as attached to his letter and he now asked permission from the Council to allow him to get gravel from our Municipal Pitt on No. 12 Road, for the purpose of graveling the long road he had now made through municipal property which was decidedly an asset to the Corporation. He also asked that he be allowed to remove a few trees from 27th Avenue in return for graveling and opening up our property by bulldozer. The Council agreed with his request and that he had gravel from our pitt on No. 12 road and the foreman would be advised and also if our loader was in the pitt that we load his truck for which he was willing to pay.

The Clerk was notified to call for tenders for gasoline, oils, and greases from the oil companies operating in the municipality, as our present contract would expire September 30.

A request from the North West Telephone Company, a subsidiary company of the B. C. Telephone Company to purchase Lot 17, N.W. of Section 12, Land 2173, for the purpose of establishing a television and radio beam station. The Council agreed that a token price of \$100.00 for Lot 17 if the company would open up 25th Avenue to the property. The Clerk would inform the company by letter of this offer.

The loss of chickens by Mr. Wynnyk was now considered. The matter would be dealt with after Mr. Wynnyk paid his dog license.

The Zoning Bylaw No. 407A was now brough to the attention of the Council relative to the zoning of Lougheed Highway. Clerk reported that sixteen owners were in favour of zoning it residential and fifteen in favor of commercial. As the commercial owners represented a much larger assessment and three times the acreage, the Council would remain neutral on the matter of zoning the portion of the highway recorded in the bylaw and that the portion remain unzoned.

Minutes of October 1st, 1955

The regular monthly meeting of the Council convened at 9:30 a.m., October 1st. Present were Reeve, Councillors Simmonds, Wood, Bailey and Dunlop. The September minutes were adopted by motion.

eu by Councillor Dunlop and Wood that the minutes of September 2nd, 9th and 14th be approved as circularized.

CARRIED

Mr. J. W. Rice addressed the Council with a plan to night patrol the business section in Haney. He had offered to give them this service for a monthly payment and was commencing October 1st, if the Council had no objection. The Reeve replied on behalf of the Council that if the expense was to be borne by the merchants and not the public the Council were agreeable to the plan and wished him every success.

The next request was from Mr. Geislier, asking for a short road north from Martin Road approximately 200 feet in length to be gravelled. Clerk was to inform the foreman to investigate and if the cost was not expberant, to gravel when time permitted.

Another visitor to the Council was Mr. McMulay of Bradewood Hill, north of Maple Ridge Park. He also was asking for gravel and grading. The grading was agreed to but the gravel would have to be delayed until truckers were available.

A request from Mr. Jones to open up 26th Road from 10th to 8th Avenue was laid over until inspection was made as to $\dot{x}x$ its possibility.

Mr. Boudon of 22nd Avenue East was also presnet and he was informed that 22nd Avenue was now receiving the attention that he had asked for.

The representative of the I.O.O.F. asked permission to hold a Tag Day on Saturday, November 26. Proceeds to accres to the Community Goodwill Fund. This was granted.

Messres Neilson and Glen again called on the Council in connection with their subdivision on 21st Avenue. They asked that the Council opened up and gravel a 20 foot strip on the Trunk Road that the Corporation had acquired. The reason for this request was to give entrance to the lots faced on the Trunk Road. The Reeve explained that crossings and entrances were a liability against the owner. However, the Council agreed in this particular case to brush and clear the strip of road but crossings and gravel would not be provided from public funds.

A letter was read from J. H. Hutchison asking for the Gilker Hill Road to be gravelled. The Foreman would investigate and use his descretion as to whether the road was ready to receive same.

Foreman O. W. Lilley was now present and the question of the 29th Avenue petition was discussed. The Clerk was instructed to write Mr. Ferguson, who had presented the petition to inform the petitioners that the road had been visited by the Reeve and Councillor Simmonds and the Road Foreman and in their opinion the petitioners were justified in asking for same improvements to it. However, the Council felt the road should not be disturbed this Fall, other than to grade when needed. It would be recommended to the new Council that widening, turn-outs and hard surfacing would be carried out in the Spring. The Council felt that a major disturbance of the road at this time would result in impassability during the winter.

Councillor Dunlpp reported that the Machinery Committee recommended the re-treading of grader tires, also new tires for the half ton trucks but they were not in favour of re-treading heavy truck tires as a whole, but would as a trial test recommend that two truck tires be recapped.

Councillor Simmonds referred the foreman to the request from Mr. W. Seniker to check the possibility of opening the road North of No. 8th Road on 25th Avenue North

It was reported that the Albion Community Club were having difficulty in draining their basement. The foreman was to check 17th Avenue beside the Albion Hall for a tile crossing to the East side.

Councillor Wood asked that the foreman check the breaking of ditch tile on River Road between the Langton and McIntosh homes, on the South side.

Councillor Dunlop asked the foreman to brush a portion of the 1st Avenue boulevard fronting the Rooke's Turkey Farm, as turkeys were being stolen under this brush cover.

Councillor Dunlop also referred to Mr. Damer, corner of Princess and Ditten Street, who needed attention to the ditch. Also the matter of cleaning Second Avenue ditch was brought up by the Reeve and Councillor Dunlop, from River Road to the wax Golf Course entrance

Councillor Bailey reported that Mr. Schimmick would accept our offer of \$100 for the necessary land, less than one quarter $(\frac{1}{4})$ of an acrea in order to re-allocate the turn of 25th Avenue South. Clerk was to notify the surveyor to carry out the survey.

Mr. A. Mattson requested the ditch to be cleaned on the Martin Road. Foreman was to be notified.

Letter was read from the W.A. Canadian Legion Branch No.88 with reference to the purchase of a poppy wreath. Clerk was to order the \$10.50 value.

Letter was read from the Maple Ridge Riders asking for a riding trail to be opened on the Road Allowance from 8th to 10th Avenue. Clerk was to notify this would be investigated.

Letter from Mary E. Campbell complaining that the pedestrian lane was being blocked by cars from the highway to the Super Value store. This would be investigated as to the painting of markings and the possibility of a curb. Mrs. Campbellwas, to be

Letter from the Greater Vancouver Water District asking for an opinion to be expressed by the Council on fluoridation. The Council were not prepared to give an opinion, as the mass of printed matter they had received had failed to impress them as to whether the subject was or was not of any material value. The felt that it was not their duty to express a public opinion, as it was purely an individual matter.

Letter from School Board No.42. Clerk was to reply that the Council had no objection to the Board of Trustees re-allocating the sum of \$10,000 for the purpose of building a new school at Pitt Lake.

Tenders for gas a oils were now received from the Imperial, Home, B.A. and Shell Oil Companies. The B. G. Oil Company, being the lowest bid at 23.15 gas, 19.00 fuel oil and furnace oil 17.90, the tender was awarded to this company, commencing October 1st, 19 to September 30th, 1955. Clerk was to notify all companies of the results. This was covered by the following motion:

ted by Councillor Wood and Simmonds that the British American Oil Company be given the Oil and Gas contract for the ensuing year.

red by Councillor Bailey and Dunlop that Zoning Bylaw No.409 receive its first and second reading.

Laboratory report was read and filed.

The Maple Ridge Hospital Board had advised the Council that they were negotiating for the acquisition of land for the hospital site, it was necessary that the Council advanced them \$12,000, which was approved early in the year.

med by Councillor Bailey and Dunlop that this Council approved the advance of \$12,000.00 to the Maple Ridge Hospital Board for the purchase of the approved Hospital Site described as a 10.49 acre portion of D.L.248, Group 1, Sketch 8399, N.W.D. On the understanding that the Hospital Board of Management agrees that upon the sale of the Hospital Bylaw Debentures the Corporation shall retain an amount equal to the advance in order to recoup the fund from which the advance was made.

The Reeve and Council required the foreman to investigate the proposed digging of the ditch on 22nd Avenue, south of Mr. Lee's This had been promised last Spring in order that Mr. Lee property. could lay his plastic water line at his own cost, in the bottom of the ditch and cover with six (6) or eight (8) inches of dirt. The ditch would also act as a drainage ditch. The foreman would investigate this possibility.

The Reeve now discussed the parking regulations. Apparently twenty-six (26) tickets for violations had been issued and nine (9) had not paid their fines. The Council agreed that there is max not other alternative present other than to summonds the offenders. Minutes of October 19th, 1955

The full Council being present the meeting convened at 8 p.m. Wednesday, October 19th, with the Reeve in the chair.

Mr. A. Hunter, our Consultant Engineer on Water Works problems, reviewed his recommendations to increase pressure and supply in our distribution system, both of which were sadly lacking at peak periods. Mr. Hunter had prepared considerable data which would be discussed with the Greater Vancouver Water Board at our next meeting in the near future.

Also, a letter from the International Water Supply was dealt with, with reference to a new source of supply contemplated from ground wells. This was also laid over to be taken up later with the Board.

Messrs Hadgkiss and Clappison, representing the Valley Natural Gas Distribution Company, solicited the Council's support for for companies presentation now being considered by the Public Utilities Commission. The Council were strongly opposed to any certificate of convenience and necessity being granted to either the B. C. Electric or Valley Gas Company without first receiving the Rater Rate Payers' vote after being presented with both companies detail of the distribution system and the Council was willing to notify the Public Utilities Commission along this line and a resolution to that affect would be prepared and forwarded very shortly, asking for either referendum or franchise to be submitted to all Rate Payers at the December election.

Correspondence dealt with: Letter from the Whonock Rate Payers Association, asking for the ditches be cleaned out on 3rd Road and 25th Avenue and that a Slow Sign be erected at the bus stop at 6th Road and 25th Avenue.

Lower Mainland Planning Board's letter with reference to a new numbering system was left over for discussion later.

Civil Defence Officer, Mr. C. W. Bond, was given permission to purchase Nursing Home Equipment, the cost at \$275.00, as reccommended by him.

Two applications for the Water Rights Branch, with the conversion of water from the Cursley spring at Ruskin, for domestic use, from Mr. Lobb and Mr. Thompson approximately five hundred (500) gallons a day, was not objected to.

A request from Mr. B. Lazicevic to purchase Lots 1, 3 and 4, South East of Section 16, Township 15, Plan 1975 was not accepted.

Letter from Mr. Frank DeWolf, asking for some protection for people residing in the density densely populated area of Maple Ridge from hunters and their fire arms. This would be investigated and taken up with the Rod and Gun Club.

Police report was read and filed.

Plan approvals:

- Noved by Councillor Bailey and Dunlop that the Plan of Subdivision of Block 3 of Part of the North 2 of Section 30, Township 12, N.W.D., be approved.
- Moved by Councillor Dunlop and Simmonds that the Plan of Subdivision of Lot 3, of Parcel P of Lot 248, Group 1, N.W.D., be approved. CARRIED
- Moved by Councillor Wood and Simmonds that the Plan of Subdivision of Lot 1, of the North Part of Block D of the North East Quarter (NE¹/₄) of Section 36, Township 11, N.W.D., be approved. CARRIED
- Moved by Councillor Johnson and Dunlop that the Plan of Portion of Lot 2 of 104.107 acre portion of the South West Quarter (SW_{\pm}^1) of Section 16, Township 12, N.W.D. and of two portions dedicated as Road, be approved.

Permission was given to the Lions Club for a Tag Day on October 21. Funds to accrue to the Blind Institute.

Tenders were now open for the sidewalk on Dewdney Trunk Road from 8th Avenue to Mountain View Crescent. The kendex bids were as follows: for five sacks of cement mix to the yard.

Fred Little - 90¢ per lineal xxxx foot Elmer Walski - 90¢ per lineal xxxx foot Valley Concrete Company - 97¢ per lineal xxxx foot.

The lowest tender submitted by Valley Concrete Company was awarded the contract as per the following motion:

Moved by Councillor Bailey and Dunlop that the tender of Valley Concrete Company to construct a five foot sidewalk, five sacks to the yard, for the price of 87¢ per linear foot, from 8th Avenue West approximately 3000 feet. Specification to be followed, to be accepted.

CARRIED

The Reeve now reported on the Foreman's back log of work, which was heavy. The Council approved that the sidewalk should be given priority, secondary highway project and the 22nd Road project.

Councillor Simmonds asked for permission for Mr. Selvey of Whonock to remove some of the over burden from the 12th Road pit. This was agreed to. He also asked that yellow markings be painted on the curb at the new entrance to the Aggia Hall. This would restrict the motorists from parking immediately in front of the entrance.

Gravel was also needed on 14th and 15th Road and the cutt-off between them East of 30th Avenue. Also, 16th Road West of 30th Avenue, 9th Road East of 30th Avenue and 32nd and 33rd Avenue.

He also requested the Clerk to write Mr. Ashworth and Mr. Skippen, relative to granting the Council 25 feet of road each side of the line.

Councillor Johnson reported that Braidwood Hill had been graded but not the road to the East from that point.

Councillor Dunlop asked for work on 19th Avenue North, as recommended some time ago, be completed. Also that there would be a request from the Doctors' Building, now being erected on 7th Avenue, that a sidewalk be built.

No further business the meeting adjourned at 11:25, p.m.

As the Reverend G. M. Phillips of Haney and also Mr. Rumley of Albion had reached their Diamond Wedding Anniversary the Reeve and Council would send their best wished supplemented with a floral gift.

Mr. R. A. Robinson, 5th Avenue, notified the Council that he contemplated erecting two small homes at the rear of his lot for the use of senior citizens. The Council had no objection if the provisions of our Bylaw were complied with.

The Reginal Planning Board requested the Council to notify them as to what the requirements would be with regard to planning for 1956. The letter was tabled for the time being.

At this moment Mr. N. M. McKay, 28th Avenue, entered the hall and warned the Council that the bank on the North side of his road allowance, which had been installed by the Corporation with Mr. McKay's permission many years ago, now needed attention, as in his opinion it was likely to slide at any time. The Council thanked him very much and would investigate the matter without delay. Mr. McKay also appreciated the hard surfacing work done on 28th Avenue.

Mr. W. Anderson asked permission for his client to erect an apparement block immediately west of the Baptist Church on Lougheed Highway. The Reeve informed him that this was a residential area and would require a hearing from the residents involved. As appartment blocks were listed as commercial buildings a hearing would be called without delay.

Mr. Smith, Trunk and 27th Avenue, south side, complained to the Council that his immediate neighbor to the west had refused him permission to enter 27th Avenue South. It is a fear that Mr. Nicholls, the neighbor, had errected his fence in the centre of the road allowance. The foreman and Council would investigate the situation.

A complaint had been made by an owner of cemmetery Lot 7 of Block 60, that cars were crossing the grave. The Council agree that a concrete curb be constructed to protect same.

Mr. Walter Helland was given permission to erect a work shop on a Corporation lot on the Fraser River bank, for which he was paying rental.

Mr. Mutcher of 17th Road East of 2nd Ave., was to be advised that the Corporation at this time would not require approximately 30 feet of his property for road purposes, as the road was a deal end ravine.

Authorization was given to pay Percy Lilley for the two days that

he lost by attending the funeral of his brother. This was in line with our agreement with the Union.

The Reeve brought up the matter of the saleable value to be placed on 50 acres now being logged by the Gordon Savage Company, as inquiries had been made in regard to purchasing same. A Committee of Councillor Simmonds and WMXXX Johnson would investigate the property and report back in regard to the price.

Discussion now arose on the drainage of Selkirk Street West and whether it should be continued across Maple Wood Drive xxx to Kenney Creek via the new Dover Road, located on the Carr property. The Council agreed that this was the cheapest and shorter way to dispose of the water. The Clerk was to so inform Mr. Carr, who would carry on from that point at his expense.

Recent flood damage over the Alouette country was now reviewed in the presence of the foreman, who was instructed to have stand-by crews for Saturday to carry on emergency work in the way of fills etc.

The Council were unanimous in removing all the grass boulevard that was left on the Trunk Road adjacent to the new sidewalk and directly fronting the Clappison homes. Foreman would di this at his first opportunity.

Councillor Dunlop reported that Mr. Belsey, corner of 5th and Lougheed Highway, was complaining about the need of keeping ditches clean at that point.

The matter of a no parking sign at the corner of Lougheed Highway and 7th Avenue was discussed and it was felt that this sign had been erected in the wrong spot. The Reeve and Council would investigate the location immediately following the meeting.

It was recommended that a publication in the local paper should be inserted to thank all those who had voluntarily offered their assistance in the flood disaster. The Fire Department and Police Force would be thanked personally at a later date.

A representative of Parsons and Brown, insurance agents, with the consent of the Council was present and addressed them on the condition of rewriting all Corporation Insurance Policies and consolidating same into one annual payment to one company. This plan had been approved by the auditors and recommended by the Clerk. It was also felt that an appraisal of all building should be made by a professional firm.

The Council instructed the Clerk to call for tenders for both an appraisal and consolidated insurance.

No further business the meeting adjourned at 12:45 p.m.

Minutes of January 6th, 1956

The Reeve and Council met for the regular monthly meeting on January 6th, with all present.

For the adoption of the December minutes, Councillor Johnson inquired as to the water works truck repairs and the Haney Garage account. It is the impression that the garage account was for parts and tires purchased and also that the Civil Defence account included both November and December.

Moved by Councillor Bailey and Dunlop that the minutes of December 2nd and 30th be approved as circularized.

CARRIED

A letter from the B.C. Flood Emergency Fund was read, outlining their rejection of our request for assistance to the recent flood victims. After a long discussion, the Reeve outlines in detail all that had transpired to date. It was then agreed that copies of all correspondence should be sent to the Cabinet, together with a letter asking for clarification of the sit. together with a letter asking for clarification of the situation and whether the Government had discussed the matter with the Flood Emergency Committe, as promised our delegation.

The District of Surrey presented a bill for \$82.72, being our share of costs of legal representation during the recent gas submissions to the Public Utilities Commission. Council agreed to pay same, with protest, as the Municipality had already assumed the expense of \$400.00, which should rightly be shared pro rata with all municipalities concerned.

Moved by Councillor Simmonds and Brown that the sum of \$82.72 be paid for legal fees (as per letter) under protest.

CARRIED

Foreman, O.W. Lilley, reported a slide on 7th Avenue, which required a fill of approximately forty-five (45) feet of concrete pipe. This work was approved, also the elimination of two bridges on 15th Road adjacent to the Nagi property. A fill and culvert pipe was recommended.

The problem of drainage on 21st Avenue and the Department of Public Works assistance in the matter would be discussed by the Reeve with the Honorable Lyle Wicks at their meeting on January 10th.

The Foreman was authorized to purchase five necessary culverts, approximate price in the neighborhood of \$800.00 each, to be used on 22nd Road, 8th Avenue, 25th Avenue North, 17th Avenue North.

. The Council now discussed the drainage problem that existed on 13th Avenue. Clerk was ordered to approach the owners between 12th and 13th Avenue with a view to granting title to the Corporation for a 66 foot road allowance. Corporation would then ditch same.

Drainage problem on 7th Avenue was reviewed and the recommendations of the foreman to connect to the present line was approved.

The lange between Lougheed Highway and North Street had been inspected by a committee, with the foreman, and reported that a concrete rtaining wall was necessary. As the matter was not urgent, it would be discussed again later when more information is available with regard to depth of old water line established twenty-five years ago and whether this would be cast iron pipe.

Councillor Johnson recommended the purchase of a second-hand Low Boy Trailer. The foreman would inspect the trailer in mind and if suitable, the Machinery Committe would 0.K. same.

Councillor Dunlop requested the Foreman to clean the ditch between Lougheed Highway and 2nd Avenue, also that the Damer Road in Hammond needed some form or drainage or more gravel. Also, that on Maple Crescent the repair of the water line last Fall had left a depression which needed filling

Councillor Bailey reported that together with the Foreman, they had visited the crossing on Lougheed Highway into the Mulhull property and recommended the extending of the culvert. The owner fronting same, Mrs. Duchard, had agreed to pay one third of the cost, the total of which would be approximately \$75.00.

Mr. P. Stein, Carrs Hill Road, requested the Foreman to investigate the possibility of drainage facilities in the front of his driveway to the River Road. He anticipated that the problem would not be a great one.

Reeve reported that the Honorable Lyle Wicks would meet the Reeves of the North Shore in the Municipal Hall, Haney on Tuesday, January 10th at 3:00 p.m.

Councillor Brown reported that the District of Surrey was anticipating a disucssion of the Public Utilities Commission relative to the distribution of natural gas.

Reeve had been Requested by Reeve Sutton of Pitt Meadows to write to the Inspector of Dams with reference to dam repairing procedure and the inspection of same. Both Reeves would sign the letter.

Councillor Dunlop had arranged January 21st as the date set for presenting medals and awards to fireman who have **ERHERINA served on the Volunteer Fire Brigade for a period of twn years. The Council were ready to under-write a portion of the costs of same and would be the sponsors of the event. He felt the total cost should not exceed \$250.00 and the Council would be reimbursed considerably by the sale of tickets for same. This was approved in general.

Clerk reported that four cases for Social Assistance was present and that all were unemployed but able to work. Council agreed that no assistance should be granted to these gases unless there was written evidence that each had attempted to procure work and also that each case, after assistances was granted, would be reviewed monthly.

Councillor Simmonds reported that the revenue from the cemmetery did not equal the maint enance cost, which was in the neighborhood of \$900.00 per year. It was agreed that an increase should be made, which would be revied at the next meeting.

Minutes of January 18th, 1956

A special meeting of the Council was held on Wednesday at 7:30, primarily to discuss the plans of the Hospital Board. Present were Councillors Dunlop, Simmonds, Johnson and Brown. As the hospital delegation was not present until 8:30, correspondence was dealt with.

A letter from the District of Surrey, asking the Council whether they would support Surrey's contemplated appeal, relative to the decision of P.U.C. regarding the distribution of natural gas. Reeve and Council felt that the decision of the Public Utilities Commission had interfered with the authority invested in the local councils. The Reeve and Concil are ready and willing to give MEKREW moral support to the Surrey appeal, but did not wish to become involved in any legal costs of such an appeal. Petition from the residents of Menzies Street East, to hard surface the road was discussed. Clerk to inform them that the road would be prepared for hard surface. Also, to look into the blocked drainage problem from Mr. Axfort's property to 2nd Ave. Mr. Axfort reportes that his land was flooding from stoppage of the ditch at this location.

Councillor Simmonds referred to 29th Ave. drainage ditch problem in the vicinity of Mrs. O.Kelly's prx driveway.

Councillor Dunlop recognized the possibility of deepening the ditch on 17th Road to 2nd Ave. by possibly 12 inches more.

Councillor Simmonds felt that if it was possible to obtain sand to use it for spreading in frost weather on hills and bridges. It was felt by the Reeve that the Edge pit at Albion could be the source of supply on the yard or load basis.

Mr. George Steeves now attended the meeting and asked for the Council's approval or rejection in a matter dealing with the Hammond Community Association's property in Hammond. This comprises of a little better than 6 acres grand stand seating capacity and bleachers, which they in general developed as a sports park. Mr. Steeves, as president, was delegated to report that the Community Club were not in the position to maintain the park any longer and they felt that it should be turned over to the Council, as property to be used for park, play-ground and recreation in general. The Community Club were prepared to convey same to be used for these purposes on the understanding that the Parks Board would administer same. The Council expressed their opinion that the Parks Board, having already been approached and having approved the plan in general, would support the purpose. Mr. Steeves was now informed of this approval so that he could report back to his committee. It was recommended that all members

of the Hammond Association should be asked to vote on the plan before any transfer was made. Council would prepare agreements and coverance dealing with the matter.

Meeting adjourned at 12:10 p.m., to reconvent at 1 p.m.

Minutes of February 8th, 1956

The full Council met Wednesday, February 8th to discuss the long program of anticipated public works for the year.

A representation from the Philharmonic Orchestra of Mr. G. Byrnell, Mr. N. Bailey and Mr. Evans, presented themselves before the Council, requesting financial support in the form of an annual grant. They explained that the orchestra was dedicated to good music and their membership was open to anyone who had received elementary training with orchestral instruments. At the present time their membership numbered about thirty (30) and were not sufficiently trained to carry on without hiring xxxxxx professionals from outside the district. Full concert orchestra strength was the minimum of fifty (50) and they found it very costly to hire professionals and to pay for sheet music. Without financial assistance, they could not accomplish their endeavour of becoming a 100% Maple Ridge concern. They felt it was a very worthy and commendable endeavour to promote this type of cultural entertainment and suggested a grant of \$200.00. The Council would consider their request when formulating the budget at a later date.

Mr. Hopper, of Ruskin, wax asked for consideration wik when the surveyor, Mr. Edge, presented for approval a subdivision plan embodying his property. It involved a road which would give much better service than No. 4 Road does at the present time. The Council were aware of this and would give the plan an earnest consideration, when same was presented.

.Mr. Simpson, representing Maple Ridge Fuels, asked for permission to instal under-ground oil tanks on the company's property on the south side of Haney Street, in the industrial section. The following motion was approved:

Moved by Councillor Brown and Dunlop that Maple Ridge Fuels Ltd. be granted permission, subject to approval of the Fire Marshals office, to place Fuel Oil Storage tanks underground on Lot 11, D.L.398, Map 155.

CARRIED

The Road Foreman, Mr. O. W. Lilley, was present and the primary purpose of the meeting was now presented by the Reeve in the form of a type written agenda of the Public Works program for the year. It dealt with all parts of the Municipality and was discussed in detail. It was decided that the program, as typed, should be considered generally as a master plan of Public Works anticipated for the year and should be referred to at all times and that a priority rating should

Lower Minland Planning Board's minutes were read and filed.

Tentative plan presented by Mr. Downes of 14th Avenue was tentatively approved.

- Moved by Councillor Bailey and Dunlop that the proposed subdivision of Mr. Downes be tentatively approved, subject to the provisions of the Road subdivision Bylaw and a 66 foot road width.
- Moved by Councillor Brown and Dunlop that a School cross-walk be marked on Dewdney Trunk Road at 9th Avenue (in line with the side-walk on the west side of 9th Ave.) and that the regular School Crossing signs be placed on Dewdney for this and also the present cross-walk at the exit from the McLean High School parking lot.

CARRIEI

Moved by Councillor Bailey and Brown that the Magistrate's salary be increased to \$1200.00 per annum purusuant to Order in Council and Atorney General's approval.

CARRIED

Woved by Councillor Bailey and Brown that the Annual Loan Bylaw No.412"A" 1956, be reconsidered, finally passed and adopted.

Meeting adjourned at 10:45 p.m.

REEVE

CLERK

The regular monthly meeting for March 2nd convened at 9:30 a.m., with Reeve and full Council present.

Building Inspector, D. Morlez, asked for the Council's review with regard to the violation of the Municipal Building Code. He reported that a Miss Fallow had purchased a lot with a small home existing thereon, on 6th Avenue, North, previously owned by J.T. Zeron. The building had been built a few years ago unknown to the existing Inspector at that time and could have occurred prior to invocation of our Building Bylaw. No permits were issued for same and no inspection given at that time. Mr. Morlez reported that the ceilings were too low and the plumbing and electrical wiring was not up to present day standards. The Council considered the matter for some time and then agreed that Miss Fallow should take out the necessary permits to rectify both plumbing and electrical wiring, on the understanding that Council did not condone prior violations which would have to be corrected if any major alterations were required later on.

School Board Trustee, L. Whitebone and Secretary, R. Tweedie, presented an incomplete sakuak School Board Budget for Council's consideration. After considerable discussion the Council reviewed the budget favourably and when figures were confirmed would give it further consideration.

Mr. Hilland, representing the United Fishermens' Union, Albion Local, asked for the Council's support on the Union's submission to go under the protection of the Unemployment Insurance Commission. The Reeve explained that the whole matter would be reviewed later on and that quite likely the Council's support would be given.

Mr. Ererise, representing the Maple Ridge Bus Transportation Service, presented briefs that he had submitted to the Superintendent of Motor Vehicle Carriers, embodying a schedule eliminating details of certain routes of the bus service. He said that patronage had falled off considerably with the result that he could not operate at a profit. He expressed the hope that he would carry on for another three months on the routes itemized and was now asking the Council to notify the Motor Vehicle Department that the routes schedule had been presented to Council. The Reeve and Council expressed that this was an unfortunate matter and were sorry it would have to occur. They would notify the department that they did not oppose the cancellations.

Representatives from the North West Telephone Company addressed the Council regarding the opening of 25th Avenue, South. The representatives explained the type of road they anticipated construcking, at their cost, and received Council's approval for same.

The Gazette Printing Company requested permission to publish the Financial Statement for 1955 in their local paper, at a cost of approximately \$85.00. This was granted.

Councillor Simmonds reported on the possibility of climbing No. 6 Road adjacent to the Whonock School House and that no time should be lost in negotiating for the proposed new cut-off. This matter was to be taken up with the Road Foreman. Also, if possible, to gravel the Kearns Road as per Sir Steven Lennard's request. Mr. Kirkwood had also requested gravel on their road. Foreman was to gravel Municipal portaion only. The remainder was the owner's responsibility.

Allan Watson informed Councillor Simmonds that he was willing to pay for a culvert, which would cost in the neighborhood of \$25.00 in order to eliminate the nuisance of sand being pushed on to his lawn from 30th Avenue.

Minutes of March 28th, 1956

The Council met with Messrs Harrison, Fox, Stewart and Associate at 3:00 p.m., Wednesday, March 28th. Their visit was to inform the Corporation of the withdrawal of Trains No. 17, west bound passing through Haney at 8:53 p.m. and No.18, east bound at 10:50 a.m. The trains would no longer run after April 27th. The C.P.R. officials notified the Council that the trains in question had created a loss to the company in excess of $2\frac{1}{2}$ millions per year. The Reeve explained that the Council were not in favour of the curtailment of service but realized that the C.P.R. controlled the situation and that the Board of Transport Commissioners would support the withdrawal due to the heavy loss. The company officials confirmed the fact that the reason was purely an economic one and felt they had no other alternative but to eliminate No. 17 and 18.

Following the withdrawal of company officials Council convened to deal with municipal matters.

Letter was read from the Maple Ridge Agricultural Association asking for an increase grant to the figure of \$500.00. This matter would be dealt with before the budget was closed.

Letter from Mrs. C.Y. Smith, complaining of losing portions of her property from the high water of Kanaka Creek and felt that the Council were responsible for same. Clerk was to notify Mrs. Smith that this was not the case, as also the end of the road had been swept away. It was considered that the foreman be notified to dump rock at the location if at all possible.

Moved by Councillor Dumlop and Bailey that the request of members of the Municipal Employees Union No.622, the Council is willing to exchange statutory holiday Easter Monday for Victoria Day, May 21st.

The delayed regular monthly meeting for April convened at 1:30 p.m., April 6th with Reeve and all Councillors present.

Mr. Trerise of the Maple Ridge Bus Company, presented a new rate schedule for his bus line, divided into three zones. Council approve same and ordered a copy to be submitted to the P.U.C., Superintendent of Motor Vehicle Department.

Moved by Councillors Bailey and Dunlop that the reviewed schedule as presented by the Maple Ridge Bus Service Ltd., including three zones, be accepted

CARRIED

Mr. W. Beaten, Co-ordinator of Civil Defence for the Vancouver area, recommended that we increased our Civil Defence appropriation from 1300.00 to approximately \$2,000.00, in order to augment the salary of the local co-ordinator to the neighborhood of \$50.00 per month instead of the present \$15.00. He informed the Council that the Corporation's share would be only 25% of same and felt that by doing this we would have a much more active service. He also advised that \$600.00 could be made available to this district for any special purpose over and above the ordinary appropriation. This would be shareable two-thirds Government and one-third Municipality and that the budget would have to be sub mitted before April 15th in order to participate. The Co-ordinator also felt that we should give consideration to appointing a new local representative, as in his estimation, the present incumbent had lost interest in the work and therefore was not giving satisfaction. Mr. Fred Routter was present and reported a disturbance of the road ditch by our work crew, with a result that the crossing into his place was not at all satisfactory. Road foreman was ordered to investigate..

A delegation from 8th Avenue north of Trunk Road, reported to Council that a rumour was active that the Municipality would not allow the use of basements for rental of suites. A letter was also on the agenda from Mrs. Brewer dealing with the same matter. Clerk reported that a situation had arisen on the subject and the Building, Plumbing and Electrical Inspector was preparing to take the matter up with the Council. Council promised to investigate the whole matter at an early date.

Police report was read and filed.

Building **INSPERENT* Inspector's, D. Morlez) letter recommended to Council not to call for **ENDERT* contracts for the new addition to the hall but allow him to supervise the construction, based on day labour, thus saving the Municipality considerable money. This was approved and Clerk was to notify Mr. Morlez. Construction to start as soon as possible.

He was ordered to proceed with the repairs with a view to converting to electricity. He was also to obtain an itemized account from the National Machinery Company.

Minutes of April 18th, 1956

Full Council met for a special meeting April 18th at 8:00 p.m.

Mr. St. Jean, Sr. requested the Council for permission to purchase timber on certain tax sale lands boundarying 19th Avenue North, known as Garabaldi Road. As the property had been dedicated for park purposes two years ago the Reeve informed Mr. St Jean that he should make his application to the Parks Board and if that board had no objection Council could then deal with the matter.

Mr. Nilson, representing the large subdivision on the corner of 21st Avenue and Trunk Road reminded Council that they had not closed the ditch as promised previously. Council realized that this work had been promised but apparently had not been taken car of due to misunderstanding. The matter would have immediate attention. Also, Mr. Nilson brought up the matter of a bad mud hole existing from 22nd Avenue north. This also would be referred to the foreman.

Letter from Alexander Robinson P.T.A. asking for immediate attention to the situation that existed on the Trunk Road with regard to speeding motorists. Their recommendation was that the woad be widened and a sidewalk be installed from Haney to Websters Corners. Council were aware of this problem due to a recent bad accident which caused the death of a child. Clerk was to notify the organization that there was a pending program under discussion to remove the mail boxes closer to property lines and to widen the existing travelled portion in certain places. Council were also aware that drætic measures would have to be taken with regard to police patrol to reduce speeding. The Trunk Road was posted with a 40 mile speed limit which was considered safe if properly observed.

Petition from residents on the Trunk Road from 5th Avenue to the Municipal Sheds asked for repaving of the surface without delay, as a bad dust situation had arisen. This section would receive priority when hard surfacing commenced shortly.

Letter from Air Cadet XMMMKK Squadron No.583 requested permission for a tag day on Saturday April 28th. Council regretted that a tag day should have to occur in order to provide funds for an organization sponsored by the Crown. However, they would not object to same if there was no other alternative.

Corporal Calvert of the Haney Detachment of the R.C.M.P., by letter, requested an additional man for his detachment. Considerable discussion followed with the result that the request was approved.

Moved by Councillors Bailey and Dunlop that the R.C.M.P. Detachment be increased by one (1) man.

CARRIED

Dr. Kettyls of the North Fraser Valley Health Unit, by letter, drew to the attention of the Council that an extension to the Hammond sewer outlet was necessary. The length would be in the neighborhood of 40 to 60 feet. Council were familiar with the situation and ordered foreman to carry out same when time and tide permitted.

Mr. K.E.B. Wildman, Assessment Commissioner, quoted Council a figure of \$16,000.00 on a 80/20 shareable basis to re-assess all improvements in the Municipality. The matter had been discussed with Council previously and they considered the necessity to comply with the Provincial Assessment Equalization Legislation, therefore, the quotation was approved by the following motion:

Also, tenders for consolidated insurance for Municipal policies were opened and discussed. Three tenders were before the Council, kew two Board Companies, Yorkshire Insurance and Scotish Mutual, one make non Board Company, Parsons Brown Ltd. The rates of the two Board Companies were identical at .887 to include supplementals, non Board Company's offer was .777, including supplementals. After considerable debate Parsons Brown Company was awarded the Municipal Consolidated Insurance with the exception of the annual policy of Fleet Insurance which was already renewed for the current year. Clerk was to bring in at the next meeting max detailed polices that were recommended, also a list of consolidations.

Reeve now reported on his recent meeting at Mission with regard to mosquito control throughout the Fraser Valley. Report was kxxxxxx lenthy and dealt with proposed allocations to the Municipalities affected. Further development would occur later which would possibly call for revision as all municipalities had not yet replied. This XXXX Council expressed their agreement with the plan.

Reeve also reported that Mission District was purchasing a car of calcium Cloride at a very favourable price. As the full car was beyond their capacity to use, 15 tons had been offered to Maple Ridge which this Council accepted as it was a sufficient quantity to give a fair trial as a test layer on our roads at a price that could not be obtained elsewhere.

Current budget for 1956 was now discussed in detail and eventually closed by the following motion:

Minutes of May 25th, 1956

Moved by Councillors Simmonds and Brown that the Minutes of April 6th, 18th and 27th be approved as circularized.

CARRIED

All Councillors Present a special meeting opened at 9:30 a.m. en Friday, May 25th.

Mr. Pallot was present and on behalf of Joseph St. Jean, offered to purchase Lots 16, 17 and 18, South West Quarter of Section 27, Plan 2622. The matter would be looked after as Councillors were under the impression that the timber had been sold previously to Nelson Bros. Clerk would report the standing of the property at next Friday's meeting.

Mr. Pallot also requested some consideration be given to the cleaning of the Haney Streets.

Correspondence:

Letter from Mr. J. Skorpada, asking for permission to rent a cabin on the River Road at the end of 6th Avenue, owned by the Corporation, was approved at \$10.00 per month. Mr. Skorpada was to repair the chimney to standards required by the Building Inspector.

Council was notified of an outside staff picinic held at Swans Point, next Sunday. All were invited.

Also a letter from School District No.42, inviting the Council to the opening of their new school at Pitt Lake on June 9th.

Long letter from Centennial Committee was read and referred to a later meeting. The matter of setting up a committee would be then thoroughly discussed.

Haney Rock Gas Company requested to demonstrate their flame thrower and it would be considered at a later date when an arrangement would be made with the Foreman.to.test same.

Yennoden Ratepayers Association asked for zoning in that area to control subdivisions to not less than la acres. This was not considered by the Council to be wise or practical. Council felt that this was perhaps more of xx. a liability to the area than an asset; particularily at the present time when consideration was being given to serving domestic water to Yennoden. Clerk was to so notify the Association.

School Board No.42 requested Council's permission to utilize the Surplus of \$126,000.00 in respect to referendum No. 1. The plan was to use same for the purpose of purchasing sites and planning of additional class rooms, as required. Clerk was to notify the School Board that Council had no objection to their plan.

Mr. McLaren asked for a decision from the Council with regard to the installation of metal septic take tanks. He informed them that he had recently installed one in his own property. The Council now considered the Building Inspector s recommendations that dealt with the matter. It is the experience of the Inspector that the metal tanks were undersize and that in a few years deteiorated and collapsed. He instanced many areas where this had happened. The following motion dealt with the matter.

Moved by Councillors Simmonds and Dunlop that the recommendation of the Plumbing Inspector to delete the words " or non-rusting metal" from Section 50 of our Plumbing Bylaw and that Paragraph C of Section 39 be amended to permit the use of three inch vent, such vent to receive minor fixtures only, be approved.

Mr. McLaren was allowed not to disturb the present installation of his metal tank. It was hoped that this was the last one that would be installed in Maple Ridge. It was the opinion of all that they were totally inadequate.

Mr. Bodar's request to clear up stumps on 27th Road for the sum of \$25.00 was tabled until Reeve and Councillors inspected the area.

Mr. Ainley and Mr. Adair, representing Maple Ridge Holdings, discussed with the Council the matter of a drainage dith through their property. As the Council felt obligated to a small extent by virtue of using the present drain as a run-off from the north side of the Trunk Road, they offered to excavate and back fill the ditch recommended by Haney Holdings on their proposed public road in the new subdivision, on the understanding

that the Company would install the catch basin, purchase and lay a ten (10) inch tile. This was agreeable to all. It was to be understood that the Corporation was only involved in one main ditch running north to 20th Road and if the Corporation shovel was available Haney Holdings could hire same at prevailing cost.

Mr. Verigin would be allowed to cut trees on the A & L right-of-way, providing he piles the brush. Also, Mr. Zeron would be allowed to install plastic pipe line at his own cost upon road to his property of 17th Avenue. 1½ inch pipe was recommended. The ditch would be dug under the direction of the Water Works Foreman.

Council approved the Inland Marine Insurance policy to cover all machinery not listed in the Fleet Insurance. Annual policy was quoted at \$438.00 by Parsons-Brown Company. Also, the policy of \$134.00 for three years to cover time lost and inconvenience in the case of all office records being destroyed by fire.

Councillors Simmonds now brought up the matter of brushing 15th Road and the price offered to Mr. Ashworth, which he considered was far too low. Reeve and Council would visit the road in question next Tuesday.

Councillor Dunlop asked for slow wigns to be placed on Lorne Road at both parks in Hammond Town Site. Also, he felt that \$12.50 should be paid to Dan J. McFarlane for removing a large stump on Waugh Street.

Councillor Johnson recommended that the hard surface be continued on 27th Avenue north of Lougheed Highway and also that dead-end signs should be errected. He also brought up the matter of widening and ditching Selkirk Street, Menzies Street and McIntosh Street, which had been discussed many times previously. Council agreed that this work should be finished this year.

The matter of the steep hill on 17th Avenue north, leading to the Barney property should also receive the work recommended previously.

Councillor Bailey recommended that 19th Avenue North and 20th Avenue South should be widened as requested in the petition from all the owners last year.

No further business meeting adjourned at 12:20 p.m.

Full Council met for their monthly-meeting on June 1st. Many delegations being present, Mr. Morlez, Building Inspector, was given first attention with the question of the violation of the Building Bylaw with regard to basement suites. The Inspector, together with the Sanitary Inspector had visited numerous basement appartments and found that in all cases a violation had been made, also no permits had been applied for or issued. In most cases it would be impossible to alter same to comply with regulations. Eventually it was decided that all residents that were leasing basement suites should be given one year to bring up the standards to the requirements of the Building Bylaw, given to June 1st, 1957.

Mrs. Hilland, representing a large delegation from 23rd Ave. North, requested the installation of water to the property owners. She was given a considerable amount of detail by the Reeve with regard to an area scheme or local improvement plan. The water committee would visit the next meeting of the 23rd Avenue residents area, held next Tuesday and would present to them the detail that they should follow.

A request was now made to open up and gravel $9\frac{1}{2}$ Avenue, North of Martin Road, adjacent to the Gatholic Church. The Foreman would carry out this work immediately trucks were available.

Mrs. J.C. Sloan presented a petition from property owners on 2nd Avenue regarding an inadequate ditch drainage in that area. A long discussion followed and a committee, including the Reeve, would thoroughly investigate the whole problem, also the question of the Golf Course drainage which was running on to private properties.

Mrs. B. Blackstock on behalf of the School Board presented a tentative plan for approval of the Smith property at the end of 13th Avenue. Apparently the School Board was considering purchasing the property for school purposes and did not requite the continuation of the coss road through same. Council would approve the plan presented later, showing the west 40 feet of the property in question being reserved for road purposes, thus connecting Ross Road North to 13th Avenue.

Mr. Pallot, on behalf of Mr. Quenton, requested permission to instal a private water pipe through Whonock Creek along a small portion of 12th Road to Mr. Quenton's property line. Permission was granted on the understanding that this did not interfere with the travelled portion of the road.

Messrs Ainley and Adair, representing Haney Holdings, presented a drainage plan prepared by Surveyor Mr. Edge, which called for a karinch drainage tile and also a 15 inch drainage tile. Delegates were asking Council to absorb the additional cost over the price of 10 inch tile. Council would consider this matter later.

Mr. W. Anderson, on behalf of Ridgeway Subdivision, offered to pay Council the cost of a dust layer of Calcium-Cloride. It is estimated that a ton would be needed, which the Council had on hand. Council agreed to sell same for approximately \$60.00 per ton and to do the spreading free of charge, as an experiment.

Mr. A. Nelson, representing Nelson Bros. Saw Mill, asked the disposition of their timber purchase on Lot 17, South East of 27, Township 12, as the lease renewal had expired on March,1954. As there was another purchaser interrested in same, Clerk was notified to advertise for tenders for timber on Lots 16, 17 and 18, South Ast 27, Township 12. It was felt by Council that if Nelson Bros. were unsuccessful in their bid that the original \$265.00 should be refunded. However, Council would deal with the matter when tenders were presented. Dead-line date would be June 18th, 1956.

Mr. Lester, representing the Golden Ears Curling Club asked the Council and Parks Board to again open up the question of selling approximately one acre of the north east corner of the Aggie

grounds for the purpose of erecting a curling rink. Prior discussion on the matter had involved only a lease being given. Mr. Lester asked for a review of the whole situation on a later date before a committmentwas made. Mr. Lester also asked for a re-consideration of the sale of the Okeson Lots No.322 and 325, in Hammond Townsite. He was representing Mr. Okeson and felt that his client should be the purchases of both. Council would review the matter again and give a decision later. The Reeve would set up a committee, consisting of himself and Councillor Johnson and another Councillor to deal with both matters.

A petition consisting of 120 owners was now read to the Council asking that a Building Permit be not granted for the proposed hall to be built on the corner of 5th Avenue. After a long debate Council decided that in view of the fact that almost all of the property owners in that area had signed a petition objecting to the building, that no permit should be issued in that location.

Councillor Bailey and Simmonds that in view of the Petition presented regarding 5th Avenue and Dewkney Trunk Road, by the people of that area, against the erection of said hall, that no building permit be issued for said purpose.

Commissioner Bailey, also representing the Maple Ridge Parks Board, was given permission to use Corporation machinery on non working days if Municipal operators were willing to work for the Parks It involved removing sand from the park, which was offered to Council for any fill they may have.

Minutes of June 20th, 1956.

Full Council met on June 20th for the mid monthly meeting at 8 p.m.

A delegation of Jehovah Witnesses were present, headed by the Reverend Johnston. The speaker requested the Reeve and Council to once more consider granting their religious organization a permit to erect their hall on the north west corner imjunction of 5th Avenue and Trunk Road. The Reeve explained that Council could not ignore the petition signed by a very majority of people in the area effected, who were opposed to the building and he could only report that if the Congregation of the Jehovah Witnesses could change their minds of the original tenders and present their signatures not objecting to building the hall, Council would reconsider their decision by re-opening the matter again.

Mr. H. Menzies presented a tentative plan for approval for the subdivision of Lot 18 of Lot 399, Plan 8813. Mr. Menzies was informed that no objection would be raised if the plan, when presented, agreed with the tentative plane left with Council at this time.

Mr. Lester, Counsel on behalf of Mr. Okeson, now requested reconsideration of sale of tax sale Lot 322 to Mr. Read. As Council were in a position to sell the property to anyone that chose to do so Mr. Lester felt that Mr. Okeson should be given his chance to purchase same. Council were not entirely of this opinion at this time and left the matter with Mr. Lester to settle to the mutual benefit of both Mr. Okeson and Mr. Lester. Mr. Lester agreed to do this and report back to Council.

Councillor Johnson brought up the matter of development of the Municipal property adjacent to the Municipal Sheds. He felt that the mechanic working there was dissatisfied with present working quarters and that our plan or erecting new building should progress at a greater rate of speed than it was doing presently. The first problem was completeing the full on the area to be built on and the Council ordered that all Municipal trucks returning from the eastern end of the Municipality should carry loads of gravel and dump same on the building spot. **REEX** Also, that a road should be built to the rear of the property in question in order to provide storage room for our water pipe deliveries.

Reeve brought up the matter of black topping the shoulder of the road fronting the store situated at the corner of 14th Avenue and 29th Road. If the owner of the property was willing to arrange for the store frontage and road shoulder to be black topped, Council would contribute \$50.00 towards same.

Councillor Dunlop reported on an open well that existed on the west end of Powerline Road, adjacent to the Pana-Bode, foreman was

to investigate and close same.

Plans for the proposed new bridge on 17th Avenue were now considered. The Reeve recommended that this bridge, if tenders were in order, should be built during the school vacation period, as the bridge was used for by school buses.
Before dealing with tenders it was necessary to visit Victoria with regard to the pending Government grant towards same.

It was reported that the extreme west of 22nd Road was in very bad condition. In the meantime the foreman would fill holes with gravel and patch within a week or ten days.

Reeve now discussed the hard surfacing and wa of East Menzies Street. This apparently had been left from the program of current hard surface work in error. He had recently a very large delegation at his house and Council agreed that as it only consisted of another 2/10 of a mile, that if funds permitted, this work should be done before plant leaved the pit.

No further business meeting adjourned at 11:10 p.m.

The matter had been previously discussed with the companies by the Reeve and Clerk. Due to the falling market on Municipal Bonds, the Reeve felt that ancouncil discussion should follow. It was explained by the Reeve and the company representatives that capital was required by many municipalities for expansion purposes and the investing public had a great field of investments to choose from, therefore the debenture issue the size of ours would require specialized advertising to sell on a falling market. It was explained that many municipalities were taking advantage of this method, including Vancouver, Surrey, Delta, Kitimat, Greater Vancouver Water Board and others. At this time it was felt that a straight debenture price would only realize in the neighbourhood of 92 at the best. The Company felt they could do better than this by specialized and selective advertising for Maple Ridge. The following motion was prepared and submitted for approval.

In by Councillors Brown and Bailey that A. E. Ames & Co. Ltd. and Odlum Brown Investments Ltd. be authorized to act as agents to the \$549,000, 42% serial debentures of the Municipality of Maple Ridge for a fee of 1% of the par value at a gross price of not less than 95.86 plus accrued interest per \$100 par value.

Minutes of August 3rd, 1956.

Full Council met for the regular monthly meeting on August 3rd.

As no delegations were present correspondence was dealt with by reading a complaint from Mrs. Melvin regarding the 6th Avenue ditch north, west side. Foreman investigated the matter and submitted the cost of approximately \$230.00 to carry out the work. He was ordered to proceed with same when time was available.

The Reeve reported to the Foreman, who was present, to provide the Clark property at the corner of 6th Avenue and Trunk Road with steps, as the newly installed sidewalk was considerably higher than the property level at that point.

Reeve also took up the matter of the request from Mr. S. Mussallem to widen with hard top the curved driveway meeting Lougheed. The Reeve and Foreman would inspect the location before proceeding.

The matter of the 22nd Road off 25th Avenue fill was also discussed. Foreman would commence same immediately crews were available.

Councillor Johnson the difficulties sustained by the residents on 15th Road due to the collapse of the bridge in the neighborhood of the Nagai property. Also, that a sign should be errected on 17th Avenue entering 15th Road that the bridge was out. This developed into a controversy with regard to damage to road barricades and signs. Clerk was to contact Mr. Whitebone in the hope that such additional width could be acquired and if successful Foreman would then carry out the work.

Delay in the construction of the 17th Avenue Bridge was reported and Council confirmed the completion date to be extended to October 31st.

Mr. & Mrs. Lynch proposed purchasing the South East corner of Trunk and 3rd Avenue for the purpose of operating a Rest Home. Clerk was to reply that Council had no objection to same, providing they carry out the necessary regulations and obtain a licence from the Department of Welfare.

Allam asking Council to contribute in the cost of dredging the Alouette River on the grounds that it would definitely safe guard Municipal bridges and roads. Our Foreman, Mr. Lilley and the Reeve also felt that this was a reasonable request and the following motion was approved.

Moved by Councillors Bailey and Dunlop that this Council agrees to contribute 50 per cent of cost to widen North Mlouette River, east of 14th Avenue Bridge to protect said bridge. Our share not to exceed \$300.00, amount will be paid providing work is completed to Foreman's satisfaction.

Councillor Dunlop, in the presence of the Foreman, brought up the matter of speeding on the newly hard surfaced portion of Powerline Road. Clerk was to refer the matter to the Police, as the minimum speed on Municipal roads was 30 miles per hour.

KMM Building Inspector, now commencing his holidays, recommended the appointment of Mr. George Mysel for the period of two weeks, to carry out the duties of Building, Plumbing and Electrical Inspector. This was approved by Council.

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Minutes of August 16th, 1956.

Full council convened at a special meeting on Thursday night, August 16th at 8:00 p.m.

Mr. Frank DeWolf was present and presented a problem at the Alouette River. He submitted a rough plan of his idea of the protection needed to safe guard the South Alouette River Bridge. In his estimation a rock fill was necessary with a log structure to protect the river wash. The Reeve and Council were somewhat familiar with the question and would await a meeting with the Provincial Engineer, Mr. Findlyson, who would be here shortly.

The agenda commenced with correspondence from property owners on 7th Avenue North, requesting road service. Clerk was ordered to acknowledge and refer the matter to the foreman for gravelling and grading, if necessary.

Mr. J. StJean, by letter, offered \$600.00 for timber cut by our road allowances adjacent to his property, lots 21 to 25, SE4, Sec.27, Twp.12. The following motion was recorded.

Moved by Councillors Brown and Simmonds that Mr. J. StJean be asked to pay an additional \$1,000.00 for timber on the road allowances surrounding the Lots No. 21, 22, 23, 24 and 25, that he purchased recently from the Municipality.

Redidents located on a side road off 33rd Avenue submitted the name of "Wandering Road". Council raised no objection to this name if that was their wish.

Haney Central P.T.A. claimed of traffic speeding in school zones and non observation of school crossings. The matter was referred to the Traffic Committee, who would take it up with the R.C.M. Police with recommendations that school crossing be errected and also the approach to same be marked with a large yellow cross. Committee would first meet with the R.C.M.P.

A request was presented for those people who had lost their homes by flood to be allowed to replace them without charge for permit.

A grant was approved for Miss Maple Ridge by the following motion:

Moved by Councillors Bailey and Dunlop that a grant of \$50.00 be made to Miss Maple Ridge, who will represent this Municipality to compete for Miss P.N.E.

Zoning Amending Bylaw No.427"A" was given first and second reading.

Moved by Councillors Dunlop and Johnson that Zoning Amending Bylaw No.427"A" be given first and second reading.

The account for the purchase of two trucks from Haney Garage was now reviewed. This was laid over for the time being, pending a check with regard to specifications required pursuant to tender.

Reeve now discussed the retiring of Sub-foreman George Dunster, whohad reached the age of 70 and also Mr. Sword. In the case of Mr. Dunster all felt that it was necessary to retain his services for one more month in order to acquaint a new sub-foreman with his work.

A request had been made from the Valley Concrete Company to excavate gravel from the Alouette River, east of 8th Avenue on Municipal property. This was allowed, subject to supervision of our Road Foreman, on the payment of 10¢ per yard royalty.

The Reeve also brought up the matter of Mr. Alexander, Parking Inspector, who was still patrolling the area and finding no violations. As this man operated on a commission and therefore received nothing for his time, it was agreed that a maximum of three rounds per week would be paid for by the Municipality, regardless of violations, at \$1.50 for each round, the maximum would be \$4.50 per week, less fines that may occur.

woved by Councillors Johnson and Dunlop that the Plan of a Portion of Lot 1 of Parcel "G" of Lots one, five, six og Parcel "F" of Lot 400, Group 1, Plan 9032, N.W.D., be approved.

The question now arose with regard to the necessity of purchasing a compressor hammer. It was recommended the cost of same would be equally charged toward General and Waterworks. The estimated cost would be in the neighborhood of \$2,000.00. Foreman would be advised to investigate the market for such a machine and report to Council. It was flet that such a machine would eliminate considerable hourly labour.

Reeve also brought up the matter of widening Dewdney Trunk Road and the questions of providing numerous expensive culverts. As there was still a considerable balance of funds left for Scondary Highway expenditure the question would be brought up when the Provincial Engineer visited this area in the next week or two, as to whether we could adjust our Secondary Highways Account to take care of this emergency work.

Councillor Dunlop inquired as to the method of sharing in sidewalks, particularly with regard to Dr. Gallagher's building on 7th Avenue. He was informed that if the sidewalk met with the specifications and approval of the foreman the Council would consider a shareability based on 50/50 division between owner and Corporation.

As the Reeve was leaving tomorrow for the Confederation of Mayors and Reeves convention at Kingston, Ontari, he informed Council that if an emmergency meeting was necessary they would elect their own chairman. In the event of two Councillors with the same seniority the problem would be theirs to decide who should take the chair.

Meeting adjourned at 10:10 P.M.

Panenerin REEVE

Minutes of September 7th, 1956.

Full Council was in attendance for their regular meeting, Friday, September 7th.

Messrs Lester and Emery, representing the Golden Ears Curling Company Limited, were in attendance and requested Council to consider conveying to the company for the sum of \$2,000.00 municipal property described as Lot 5 of Lot 398, Group 1, Plan 4499 and a portion directly north, approximately 48 feet by 105 feet for the purpose of erecting their curling rink. The matter was discussed at great length, each Councillor being contacted and the general opinion seemed to be in favour of this, on the understanding that it was definitely a community concern, but the final decision would be given at a later date, when more particulars were presented and the location was thoroughly examined and provision made to remove the presently existing municipal shed off the property.

Mr. Lempki of Hammond had a water problem and asked the Council to install a line to his lot. The Water Committee would visit the location and deal with the matter.

Mr. Luther of North Street complained of blocked drainage tile that existed fronting his property. He asked for immediate attention as the matter had been delayed considerable times. Foreman would investigate and remedy the matter.

Correspondence was now dealt with. Letter from Jack Biggs asking for the confirmation of permission given him a few years ago to cut fire wood on Corporation property adjacent to our No.6 Road Gravel Pit. This was approved and Clerk was to notify Mr. Biggs.

Letter from the School District No.42 asking for correction of the exects off the No.6 Road Pit school property. The School Board were prepared to install a culvert at their expense, under the direction of the Municipality. Foreman would investigate the matter and deal with same, at School Board's cost.

Mr. C. Sheppard complained, by letter, of a drainage problem effecting his property on 14th Avenue, Lot D of SW4, Sec.28, Twp.12, Plan 15594. He asked the Corporation to install a culvert or provide xxx sufficient fill to overcome the condition. Clerk was to write suggesting that culverts were already present but were apparently blocked and Foreman would see that they were cleaned out.

Mr. Cadsand's claim for the loss of a pure-bread registered sheep, requesting \$50.00 compensation was not approved as apparently there was no evidence to prove that the ewe had been killed by dogs.

Letter from the B.C. Assessors Association advised Council of their next convention at Vernon, September 12, 13, and 14. Permission was given for the Assessor to attend if he so wished.

Lower Mainland Regional Planning Board's minutes were noted and filed.

A letter from T. Mace, Trunk Road East, stating that his request to the Parks Board to cut shakes on property administered by the Parks Board on the north east side of Whonock Lake, had been referred to the Council. He now requested Council's permission to take out cedar shakes. This was not granted.

Police Report was read and filed.

Mr. R. King, owning property described as the $W_{\overline{z}}^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of Lot 4, $NW_{\overline{z}}^{\frac{1}{4}}$, Section 16, Township 15, asked for a gravel road adjacent to same. Councillor Simmonds would investigate this as there appeared to be a road that never had been opened. If only a few loads were necessary Councillor Simmonds would deal with the matter.

X AB As Foreman, Mr. Lilley, was now present Councillor Simmonds asked for something to be done about the drainage problem that existed around the Municipal Hall and Health Centre. Foreman reported that the hard surface and patching program was almost completed and he would now examine the drainage system at the Hall.

Councillor Dunlop requested crushed gravel to be laid on the Dyke Road Hammond. The Councillor also reported that he had complaints about the patching done around the Hammond district and would like the Foreman to investigate the matter. Also, that the sidewalk had been broken adjacent to the Central Garage. He felt that whoever did same should compensate the Municipality for replacement, which should take place without loss of time. Also, the parking problem in front of the Hammond Hall still existed. He flet that the remedy would be to paint No Parking Signs on the hard surface and also on the hall building. Councillor Dunlop also asked for ditches to be cleaned across the track. This brought up the report from the Reev with reference to the considerable ditch deepening that had occurred on the Goldie property. Mr. Goldie was now faced with a bill in the extent of \$500.00. He felt that the Corporation should pay the cost of this ditch as it definitely improved the general water run-off in lower Hammond. The Councillors were xex eventually agreed on this point and all felt that the Municipality should assist Mr. Goldie in the payment of this account, preferably by a direct payment to the Dyking Commissioner.

Mr. Larry Verigin entered the hall and asked permission to cut fire wood adjacent to his home on the A&L right of way, $SW_{\frac{1}{4}}$, Sec.12, Twp.12, verbal permission was given, on the understanding that he pile the brush at the same time.

Messrs Edge and Trethewey presented a problem to the Council with regard to a low area that existed on 32nd Road, west of 8th Ave. They estimated it would take in the neighborhood of 500 yards km of fill to strengthen this. Reeve and Council were of the opinion that they were correct. Reeve would get in touch with the Foreman and visit the spot.

It was also suggested by Mr. Trethewey that lower 5th Avenue should receive a facing of rock in the depressed spots where flood waters effected. He felt that the rock would hold the road from being washed away.

Sprinkling regulations were now discussed and it was felt that Council would not legally lift same but would not prosecute if people sprinkled beyond the restricted hours.

Mr. Savage of Savage Mill asked for an extension of time to remove timber from a portion of Municipal land. The following motion dealt with same.

Moved by Councillors Simmonds and Brown that an extension of one year period be given to Savage Bros. to remove the timber on the SW1 of the NW1 and also Lot 5 of Section 18, Twp.12.

Mr. Mike Bodnar's offer to dig the water ditch on 15th Road and 15th Avenue was verbally approved, pursuant to Bylaw No.429, for the sum of \$800.00. The length was approximately 2800 feet and depth not less than 18 inches.

The question of building a Municipal reservoir east of the Websters Corners tank was discussed considerably and the Committee recommended to investigate and commence the project as soon as possible, as any additions to the water connections east of 17th Avenue would aggravate the problem unless adequate storage was beyond 25th Avenue.

Permission was given to Mr. T. Griffiths to build on a lot situated on 9th avenue, next to his home. His lot was smaller in area than the Bylaw called for. Mr. Griffiths' plan of approval was passed prior to our Minimum Frontage and Area Bylaw.

Moved by Councillors Brown and Dunlop that Bylaw No.426"A" be reconsidered, finally passed and adopted.

Mr. Mysel is a certificated xx qualified electrician and could temporarily fill the place of the inspector during his absence. He informed Council that he (Mr. Morlez) would have to spend considerable time in the hospital very shortly, due to a fractured foot. Therefore, it was necessary to retain the services of a competent man. Mr. Mysel was engaged for the remainder part of the year at \$200.00 a month. Mr. Lester was present with reference to an aution of portion of the Civic Centre in favour of the Golden Ears Curling Club. Copies of the Council were left for perusal by all members of the Council to study and be dealt with later.

Correspondence opened with request from the Lions Club to hold a Tag Day to benefit the Canadian National Institute for the Blind on October 20th. This was granted.

Nelson Brosl Sawmills asked for an extension in time to remove the timber on the NW_{π}^{1} , Sec. 12. This was granted to expire on October 31st, 1957.

Mr. Cadsand's claim for loss of pure-bread ewe valued at \$50.00 was approved at 50% of that value.

Moved by Councillors Brown and Simmonds that Mr. D. Cadsand be paid \$25.00 for loss of ewe killed by dog.

CARRIED

Canadian Pacific Railway's letter with reference to replanking crossing at mile 95 and \$275.00.

Letter from Mrs. J.R. Westin for hard surfacing on 20th Road was read. Clerk was to advise that this would be considered in 1957 estimates.

The Beckstrom Towing Company's offer to purchase Fraser River frontage between 6th and 7th Avenues was not considered as Council felt this would be sold only for a heavy industrial site, having both water and rail frontage.

The request from the Salvation Army for a further grant for their building fund was held over.

Mr. McCormick, representing the firm of Ames and Company and Odlum Brown, now addressed the Council with the difficulty in disposing of our \$549,000.00 Hospital Debenture Issue. He outlined the impossible situation that had arisen by his attempt to curb inflation. He instanced many issues that had received no offer to purchase at all and at the present moment doubted very much if their firm could even interest the public with a discount of 10%. He strongly recommended that we wait until tenders for the hospital construction were opened. All agreed that this was the wise plan to follow in order to protect the tax payer. Mr. McCormick retired.

Road Superintentend, Mr. Lilley now entered the hall. His immediate problem was that the powder shed should be removed from the area to our new Municipal Shed construction program which had now commenced. The matter would be taken up with the Farmers Institute by the Clerk.

It was reported that garbage was blowing from the garbage collectors trucks travelling on Municipal roads. Clerk was to notify the proprietor to correct this condition.

A copy of a letter sent to the Local Union No.622 (Municipal workers(by Frank Zeron, our grader operator, stating that he was qualified for the position of Assistant Foreman was read to Council. However, the Road Foreman's recommendation that T. Coward be appointed to the job was approved.

Foreman was ordered to carry out the drainage plan approved last Spring on Selkirk and McIntosh Streets, which called for ten inch tile, catch basins and the levelling of culverts.

Councillor Johnson reported that seven new truck tires were needed.

Foreman was instructed to procure same plus rebate by turn-in of used ones.

The dirt bank on 28th Avenue North (McKay) had been visited by Reeve and two councillors together with foreman. The work was now ordered to proceed as soon as the shovel was available. Foreman and committee were also to proceed with the buildings at the Municipal Sheds, size approximately 30x40.

Councillor Simmonds asked for the grading of 9th Road east of 17th Avenue.

The Rebecca's request by Councillor Simmonds for a Tag Day on October 26th for the purpose of Emas cheer was allowed.

The Reeve now reported a drainage problem runs on Mrs. Roger Harris' propertyon 82 Ave. He had visited the location with the Foreman and Mr. Lester. Levels and had been taken and the want know to relieve the flooding was to the north: Council felt that if a contribution to tile the approved runx crossing, was forthcoming the work should be proceeded with.

The Okeson-Reid tax sale propertywas again discussed after reading a letter from Mr. Reid. This was again tabled for Lawyer Lester's report.

Tenders for the supplying of gasoline, fuel oil and furnace oil from October 1st, 1956 to September 31st, 1957 were now opened. The lowest tender bid was by B.A. Oil Company at 22.90¢ gasoline, fuel oil 19.0¢ and furnace oil 17.9¢. The contract was awarded to that firm by the following motion:

Minutes of November 2nd, 1956.

Full Council convened for their monthly meeting, November 2nd.

Moved by Councillors Simmonds and Dunlop that the minutes of November 10th and 25th be approved as circularized.

CARRIED.

Building Inspector, D. Morlez, presented two plans for the proposed layout to house Municipal machinery. He asked for xix decision to enably him to install permanent water and electrical fixtures. One of the plans had been designed by Councillor Johnson, the other by Mr. Morlez. It was readily seen that both plans had their merits and expressions were made on the advantageous point of each. It was felt and agreed that Councillor Johnson and Mr. Morlez would be given a little more time together to finalize a layout that would be satisfactory to all concerned.

Mrs. C.S. Pallot requested Council to consider opening the Municipal Office all day Saturday and closing on Monday. Council recognized the benefits that would accrue to the taxpayer, but the Reeve explained the difficulty that would arise as neither the Motor Vehicle Department of the Social Welfare Department would be allowed to operate on Saturdays. Also, no banking facilities would be available on that day and to add to this the balance of the office would be handicaped as most of the routine work was left over and completed on Mondays when the stores were closed.

The agenda was now referred to. Letter from Mrs. Trethewey asking for the naming of certain new roads that she was prepared to plan. Her recommendation that three roads should be named Walnut Place, Park Lane and Cedarway, as only one plan had yet been approved showing what would be known as Walnut Road, Council felt that it would be better to deal with the matter when all roads had been accepted by the Municipality. In the meantime, if Mrs. Trethewey wished to erect her own signs, Council would have no objection.

Letter from Mrs. Dora Bols requesting a pathway or sidewalk be established on 23rd Avenue east to the bridge, would be left over until the new year, as it is quite possible that the Websters Corners Bridge would be disturbed considerably or completely replaced with a fill. The matter would be reviewed again when that occurred.

The G.S. McNutt's application to purchase tax sale lands, approximately 150 acres from the SE_{4}^{1} , Section 11, Township 12, Plan 2580 and also Lots 3-15, SE_{4}^{1} , Section 16, Township 15, was not accepted as Council desired to hold same for the time being.

Letter from Mr. R.E. Lester with reference to the ditching of 8th Avenue asking what kind of deal is expected from the owners. Council recommended that the owners should provide the tile material and Corporation do the work. Foreman would notify the Clerk was to the quantity and cost of material before replying to Mr. Lester.

Complaint from F. Zeron with relation to the appointment of the Assistant Foreman. Clerk was to notify Mr. Zeron that if the grievance was submitted to Council by Union Grievance Committee the Council Grievance Committee would meet and discuss the matter with them.

Foreman Lilley was now present and requested permission to hire a trench hoe in order to take care of sewer line on 7th Avenue as our shovel was engaged at the Kanaka Creek Bridge. Foreman was given permission to do so.

Both Foreman and Councillor Bailey brought up the condition of 21st Avenue, below the Institution site. Apparently the run-off of water was aggravated by drainage from the Institution. As considerable expense would be involved in taking care of this, Reeve would take the matter up with our local provincial representative, Minister Lyle Wicks.

Councillor Dunlop asked for slow signs to be erected at the Dutch School on Trunk Road, west of 5th Avenue.

Councillor Simmonds brought up the matter of gravel and sand that was washed onto the W. Jones' property on 6th and 25th, Also, that the small bridge on 33rd should be checked. Foreman noted same.

Councillor Johnson asked foreman to visit 27th and 14th, adjacent to the Kurshaw property with regard to ditch cleaning.

Also, a complaint from a resident on 19th Avenue reporting that our ditches were running water onto his property.

Councillor Dunlop referred Foreman to the blocked culvert ditch fronting Mrs. MacPhaden's property, Trunk Road east of 27th Avenue. Also to check if khair there were any no parking signs at Hammond Hall.

Also, Mrs. Kennedy on 18th Road east of 1st Avenue complained of ditch trouble.

Councillor Bailey asked for stumps to be removed opposite the Hepburn place on Trunk Road.

The continuation of 21st Avenue south, through the Nagai property was brought up again by the Reeve. He had approached Mr. Nagai and they were now waiting for the area that would be allowed for this undertaking.

It was reported that the B.C. Electric when erecting a pole had washed one of our culverts on 30th Avenue opposite the Shrove property. Clerk was to take the matter up with the B.C. Electric after obtaining the cost from the Foreman for redigging the ditch around the pole.

Mr. Peterson of 12th Avenue again presented a petition asking for a complete renevation of the road. Reeve promised that this would definitely be taken care of in 1957.

Bids for the sale of timber were no opened from Nelson Bros. Sawmill, on Lot 19, SW¹/₄, Section 27, Township 12, Plan 222. Nelson Bros. bid was for \$750.00. J. St. Jean's bid was \$1150.00 plus \$300.00 for the portion of road allowance east of Lot 16 & 17, Plan 2622. The St. Jean

Minutes of November 15th, 1956.

Court of Revision of the Voters' List opened with full Council present on November 15th at 10:00 a.m., also the Hearing for the Wicklund Road Local Improvement Water Main.

*Moved by Councillors Simmonds and Dunlop that Reeve P. Jenewein be Chairman of the -Court of Revision for Local Improvement Water Main, Wicklund Road and L.W. Hawkins act as Clerk.

CARRIED.

Moved by Councillors Bailey and Dunlop that Reeve P. Jenewein act as Chairman of the Court of Revision for the 1956-1957 Voters' List and L.W. Hawkins act as Clerk.

CARRIED.

Mr. A.L. Sharp bitterly protested the maximum 120 foot exemption from foot frontage rates allowed on his property. Reeve explained that this was a statutory exemption allowed under the Local Improvement Act and that we could offer him no help in the matter. Mr. Sharp was the only owner who had not signed the petition for the water main, which passed his property.

Mr. S.B. Gervin, Solicitor for Jehovah Witnesses , applied to the Council for a permit to be issued to his clients to erect a Church on the corner of 5th Ave. and Dewdney Trunk Road or state Council's reasons for refusal of permit. The Reeve explained many reasons for delay in issuing the permit, which had been applied for in June previously. Primarily, the main reason was due to the petition presented to Council, signed by 95% of the surrounding owners adjacent to that corner. The petition was an objection to a Kingdon Hall being built in that particular spot. They felt it would definitely depreciate the value of all surrounding properties. Also, a letter of protest had been filed with the Council by the owner and operator of the Rest Home immediately east of the proposed building site. The reason stated in the protest was that the noise of the car traffic would disturb the rest of the patients. The Reeve explained that Council considered it their duty to consider both petitions and that the members of the Jehovah Witnesses had been advised to recanvass the district in the hope that those signing the petitions would change their minds and that if such a revised petition was presented to Council they would reconsider the whole matter. Each Councillor expressed his individual opinion and all felt it was their duty to consider the majority affected and that mnay other problems were present, such as sewerage disposal for such a large assembly hall. As nothing was shown on the plans when presented, when application was made for the permit, with regard to this, both the Sanitary and Building Inspectors had requested the permit be held up. Reeve and Council felt that if they were , wrong in their opinions and their duty was not to protect the majority, that some higher authority should over-rule them.

Mr. Hemminger of 22nd Road east of 14th Avenue complained of an overflowing ditch onto his property. This would receive foreman's attention.

Mr. Stephens, representing interests that had proposed to build a mausoleum in the Maple Ridge Cemetery, without cost to the Corporation, thoroughly explained the detail of the construction. The size of the property requested would be approximately 38'x40' and the building erected would be 35'x40', constructed of 9 inch re-inforced correte walls and roof and 12 inch concrete floor. Outer walls would be lined with Indiana Lime Stone, highly polished. The building would require no maintainence and would take care of twice as many burials as the ground area underneath could provide. The company was prepared to pay \$1,500.00 for the site, if the project was accepted. He was now asking for an option, preferably good for the next xxx seven months. If the response from the public was receptive to purchase the burial vaults the company would construct the building, entirely free of all cost to the Municipality. When all vaults were fully paid off the property would revert back to the Corporation. The Council felt they had nothing to lose, as they were to receive \$1,500.00 to doubly fill the burial capacity. The plan was approved as presented and the option would be signed.

Mr. W. Hope asked for the deepening of the ditch on 7th Ave. north of the Trunk Road. Foreman would be advised.

A very much delayed problem was now discussed. That of the sale of Lots 322 and 325 which Corporation had acquired by tax sale procedure and eventually by Crown Grant free of all encumbrance. The defaultor was Mrs. Lilliam Okeson, who in 1953 had sold Lot 322 to Mr. Reed, who had not bee allowed to register his agreement, therefore received no tax notices. It was felt by Council that a loss had been sustained by Mr. Reed who had already paid \$1,500.00 in

Loss had been sustained by Mr. need who had alleady paid \$1,000.00

installments on Lot 322 and Council had been prepared to turn over a clear title to him in payment of all costs to the Municipality. A Bylaw to this effect had been prepared but not executed to final reading. Evidence was submitted later that Mr. Reed was partly to blam for non payment of taxes. A committee had been set up of the Reeve and Clerk, together with Councillor Dunlop and legal representatives from Mrs. Okeson and Mr. Reed to clarify the whole matter. This committee came to the unanimous decision that justice would prevail if bothx Lots 322 and 325 were deeded to the original owner, Mrs. Okeson, and that a new agreement of sale be made to Mr. Reed by Mrs. Okeson, who had also paid to the Corporation for the two lots, the total sum of \$1,103.34. The following motions approved same.

Moved by Councillors Dunlop and Simmonds that recommendation of the Special Committee set up to investigate the sale of Lots 322 and 325 of Lot 279, Group 1, Plan 114 be accepted, and that we refund the deposit of \$230.00 paid by Mr. D.R.Reed, together with 6% interest on the amount for seven months and that we now sell Lots 322 and 325 to Lillian Okeson, for the total sum of \$1,013.34. A deposit of \$560.62 having alread been made. The blance due will be \$452.72.

CARRIED.

Moved by Councillors Dunlop and Simmonds that the first, second and third reading of Bylaws No. 417"A" and 419"A" be rescinded.

CARRIED.

Moved by Councillors Dunlop and Simmonds that the rule of procedure be suspended and notice of motion dispensed with and Tax Sale Bylaw No.431"A" be read three times this day.

CARRIED.

Moved by Councillors Dunlop and Simmonds that the Bylaw No.431"A" be read a first time.

CARRIED.

Moved by Councillors Dunlop and Simmonds that the Bylaw No.431"A" be read a second time.

CARRIED.

Moved by Councillors Dunlop and Simmonds that the Bylaw No.431"A" be taken as read.

CARRIED

Moved by Councillors Dunlop and Simmonds that the Bylaw No.431"A" be read a third time.

CARRIED.

Moved by Councillors Dunlop and Simmonds that the Bylaw No.431"A" be taken as read the third time.

CARRIED.

Mr. Fairweather's cheque for \$2500.00 was now ordered held back until he cleared up the brush when cutting down limbs on the Corporation bullevard, in Hammond.

Councillor Johnson now wished to record that he was against continuing and completing of the mechanic building and the men's lunch room if the cost of same was to exceed the original estimate of \$5,000.00. He strongly recommended that the foundation of the truck base should be installed before the frosty weather occurred. He was advised that the cost of the building, as is at the present time, would be investigated, as to whether the cost of completion would be within the budget figure. All agreed that it would be a good idea to commence the foundation before frosty weather, if at all possible.

Councillor Johnson also asked the Clerk to investigate as to why Mr. Streng on 8th Avenue, was charged for two water connections.

The Reeve now reported on his investigation with the R.C.M.P., on the Constables behaviour, as complained about by Councillor Johnson at the previous meeting. Reeve reported that he had a long talk with Sergeant Calvert and found that in two instances Councillor Johnson' accusations were correct. The opinion of the Council was divided as to whether the matter should be taken to a higher authority, other than our local detachment. The matter was left for further consideration.

Moved by Councillors Johnson and Dunlop that the tentative approval be given to subdivision of Part of Lots 2,3 and 4 of Lot 397, Plan 3175, subject to the requirements of Road Subdivision Bylaw and Foreman's approval of same.

CARRIED.

Moved by Councillors Bailey and Dunlop that Fuller Watson's application to finish and complete the third story of their business block on Tougheed Highway and to provide eight suite appartments will be approved, providing all the regulations and requirements as specified in our Building and Plumbing Bylaws are carried out and approved by the Inspectors. Existing foundations and structure must be of sufficient carrying strength to **Example** support the third story.

The Company stated that due to the very low patronage the result was considerably less to them and they had to either reduce the schedule or cut off the service entirely. A Estimate was presented on Gazette letterhead which had been prepared for the Board of Trade publication advertising in the Municipality. This was postponed intil the Board of Trade members were present.

The option given to E.H. Stevens to purchase certain lots in the Maple Ridge Cemmeterywere now defined and approved as Lots 1 to 9 & 44 to 52, Block 26 and Lot 1 to 9 & 44 to 52 of Block 31, including the 6 foot road allowance lying between.

B.C. Polio Fund sponsored by the Kinsmen Club was now read, noted and filed.

Minutes of December 6th, 1956, continued.

Foreman now entered the Hall and reported that the sand program had been well distributed over the x icey roads and that 17th Avenue Bridge was now opened and black topped. In his opinion the 25th Avenue Bridge would have to be replaced very shortly and should receive priority. It would cost in the neighborhood of \$4,000.00. Council agreed with him and ordered him to arrange his work to take care of this as soon as possible.

Councillor Bailey asked for information about the 21st Avenue drainage problem, Foreman reported they were still awaiting a report from the Provincial Engineer, promised by Honourable Lyle Wicks.

Manager of the B. C. Forest Products, according to Councillor Dunlop, required a letter from Council giving authority to their company to open up Melville St. for their benefit. The company would assume all costs. This work would be done under the supervision of the Foreman and Clerk was to notify Mr. Pendleton of this.

The depressed money market was severe when Municipal bonds $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ were discounted at least $12\frac{1}{2}\%$, with no promise that any financial house would take the full issue. The Hospital Board had recently assured founcil that the contract could be given to the tender if $87\frac{1}{2}$ could be realized for the whole \$549,000 issue. The Council's interest was to see that an operating hospital could be provided pursuant to the Bylaw at the discounted figure if it was at all possible. The following motion approved a visit to Victoria in an attempt that we get a better offer.

Moved by Councillors Brown and Bailey that the Reeve, Mr. Hadgkiss, Mr. M. Brown and Mr. McCormick endeavor to hypothecate the Maple Ridge Hospital Debentures either with the Provincial Government or the Bank. Failing this that the debentures be sold at the best possible price in order that the Hospital be built under the present tender being considered.

The owner was apparently not in favour of an open ditch across his property and the Reeve felt that in places the cut would be at least seven feet deep, in order to obtain the fall. He recommended that proper levels be taken before any commitment was made, as the project would also require a fill which would involve considerable expense. Therefore, the owner and the Corporation should have a written understanding before work commenced. The location would be again reviewed within two weeks.

The Reeve felt that the 15 inch culvert installed by the Corporation through the United Church property would solve that drainage problem and the 12 inch existing tile would not be disturbed.

The Foremand had been instructed to count the number of driveway crossing on the Trunk Road opposite the cannery where an 18 inch tile had been considered satisfactory. This work would be estimated and x included in the Secondary Highway 1957 Account.

Mr. Newton, corner of $9\frac{1}{2}$ Avenue and Martin Road, opposite the Catholic Church had requested five or six 10 inch tile in order to replace broken ones crossing his driveway. Reeve would instruct the Foreman to provide the tile and inspect the installation to be done by Mr. Newton.

Councillor Dunlop requested that the Provincial Sanitary Inspector inspect the Christensen mink farm on 3rd Avenue, as complaints had been made about same.
